#### DECISION OF THE TRIBUNAL

- 1. The tribunal has considered the Applicant's request for permission to appeal dated 20 November 2020 and determines that:
  - (a) it will not review its decision; and
  - (b) permission be refused.
- 2. In accordance with section 11 of the Tribunals, Courts and Enforcement Act 2007 and rule 21 of the Tribunal Procedure (Upper Tribunal) (Lands Chamber) Rules 2010, the applicant may make further application for permission to appeal to the Upper Tribunal (Lands Chamber). Such application must be made in writing and received by the Upper Tribunal (Lands Chamber) no later than 14 days after the date on which the First-tier Tribunal sent notice of this refusal to the party applying for permission to appeal.

# APPENDIX TO THE DECISION REFUSING PERMISSION TO APPEAL

For the benefit of the parties and of the Upper Tribunal (Lands Chamber), the Tribunal records below its comments on the grounds of appeal.

### Specific comments on the grounds of appeal

- 1. The Tribunal was fully aware the Property did benefit from double-glazing (see paragraphs 27, 42, 44, 49-52, and 56 of the decision), but this did not affect the Tribunal's findings as to whether a relevant housing offence had been committed and/or whether the defects were causing excess cold and water penetration.
- 2. No inspection was necessary given the clear photographic evidence of the Respondent. The Applicant's photographs were not referred to by him during the hearing, and are not dated to the date of the relevant housing offence on 28 March 2019.
- 3. The Respondent's photographs clearly showed rotten, warped and insecure woodwork: see paragraph 60 of the decision.
- 4. The "recent" EPC accompanying the permission application was not in evidence before the Tribunal, and is not dated to the date of the offence which the Tribunal found proven. For that reason, it is irrelevant to the decision which is sought to be challenged.
