Nature of Complaint

The Information Commissioner (the "Commissioner") has received a complaint which states that on the 23rd February the following information was requested from the Cabinet Office under section 1 of the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (the "Act"):

Copies of correspondence between the Prime Minister and Lord Birt from the 1st July 2004.

It is alleged that the Cabinet Office did not respond to the request within 20 working days.

The Commissioner's Decision

Under section 50(1) of the Act, except where a complainant has failed to exhaust a local complaints procedure, or where the complaint is frivolous or vexatious, subject to undue delay, or has been withdrawn, the Commissioner is under a duty to consider whether the request for information has been dealt with in accordance with the requirements of Part I of the Act and to issue a Decision Notice to both the complainant and the public authority.

The Commissioner's decision is as follows:

The Cabinet Office responded to the complainant's request by letter dated 1st April 2005. In that letter, the complainant was asked to refine his request by specifying a more restricted time period. The complainant refined his request by email dated 7th April 2005, to cover the period between 1st November 2004 and 1st April 2005. The complainant received a response by letter dated 6th May 2005 informing him that the information requested was considered to be exempt under section 35(1)(a) of the Act. This Decision Notice is concerned solely with the timeliness of the response made to the complainant's request.

In failing to respond to the complainant's request dated 23rd February 2005 until 1st April 2005, the Cabinet Office did not deal with the request in

accordance with the requirements of Part I of the Act in that it has failed to comply with section 10(1).

Section 10(1) states "...a public authority must comply with section 1(1) promptly and in any event, not later than the twentieth working day following the date of receipt."

Action Required

The Commissioner does not require any remedial steps to be taken by the Cabinet Office.

Right of Appeal

Either party has the right to appeal against this Decision Notice to the Information Tribunal (the "Tribunal"). Information about the appeals process can be obtained from:
