

Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA) Decision notice

Decision (including any steps ordered)

- 1. The complainant has requested information about Waiting List Initiative Payments as referenced by the audit committee of the Mid Yorkshire Hospitals NHS Trust (the Trust) in the minutes of its meeting of 9 May 2011.
- 2. The Information Commissioner's (the Commissioner's) decision is that the Trust did not deal with the request for information in accordance with the FOIA in the following way:
 - It failed to provide a response to the request within the statutory time frame of 20 working days.
- 3. The Commissioner requires the Trust to take the following steps to ensure compliance with the legislation:
 - to respond to the request in accordance with the requirements of the FOIA.
- 4. The Trust must take these steps within 35 calendar days of the date of this Decision Notice. Failure to comply may result in the Commissioner making written certification of this fact to the High Court (or the Court of Session in Scotland) pursuant to section 54 of the Act and may be dealt with as a contempt of court.



Request and response

 On 6 June 2011 the complainant made the following information request to the Trust. This was in respect of minutes of 9 May 2011 from the Trust audit committee which referenced a report into Waiting List Initiative (WLI) Payments:

'Please supply me with a copy of the WLI report itself and answer the following:

- How many payments over and above the sessional rate were made and what was the total value?
- When were the overpayments made, to how many individuals and for how long?
- What is the actual agreed sessional rate?'
- 6. The Trust has not responded to this request.

Scope of the case

7. The complainant contacted the Commissioner to complain about the Trust's failure to respond to the request.

Reasons for decision

- 8. Section 10(1) of the FOIA states that a public authority in receipt of a request for information has a duty to respond within 20 working days.
- 9. Despite the Commissioner's intervention, the Trust has not responded to the complainant's request for information or conducted an internal review.
- 10. From the information provided to the Commissioner in this case it is evident that the Trust did not respond to the complainant within the statutory time frame.



Right of appeal

11. Either party has the right to appeal against this Decision Notice to the First-tier Tribunal (Information Rights). Information about the appeals process may be obtained from:
