Decision (including any steps ordered)

- 1. The complainant has requested details of the measures in place to retain data relating to the work of the Department for Education (the "DfE") from the private email accounts of its employees, including civil servants and special advisors, who subsequently leave the DfE. The complainant has not received a substantive response to this request.
- 2. The Commissioner's decision is that the DfE has breached section 10(1) of the FOIA by failing to respond to the complainant's request promptly or at all within 20 working days. The Commissioner requires the DfE to take the following steps to ensure compliance with the legislation:
 - state which information it holds within the scope of the complainant's request; and
 - communicate the information it holds to the complainant and/or issue a refusal notice in respect of all or the parts of the information it intends to withhold in accordance with section 17 of the FOIA.
- 3. The DfE must take these steps within 35 calendar days of the date of this decision notice. Failure to comply may result in the Commissioner making written certification of this fact to the High Court pursuant to section 54 of the FOIA and may be dealt with as a contempt of court.

Request and response

- 4. On 19 December 2011, the complainant wrote to the DfE and made the following request:
 - "...please inform me what measures [the DfE] has in place to retain data relating to the work of the [DfE] from the private email accounts of employees, including civil servants and special advisors, who subsequently leave the [DfE]."
- The DfE acknowledged this request in an email dated 20 December 2011. However, it did not provide any further response in relation to this request.

Scope of the case

6. On 1 February 2012 the complainant contacted the Commissioner to complain that his request had not been responded to by the DfE.

Reasons for decision

- 7. Section 1(1) of the FOIA provides that any person making a request for information to a public authority is entitled
 - a. to be informed in writing by the public authority whether it holds the information of the description specified in the request, and
 - b. if that is the case, to have that information communicated to him.
- 8. Section 10(1) of the FOIA provides that a public authority must comply with section 1(1) promptly and in any event not later than twenty working days following the date of receipt.
- 9. In this case, the complainant submitted his information request to the DfE on 19 December 2011. However, other than an acknowledgement email sent the day after the request was made, the DfE has not provided a response to this request. Consequently, the Commissioner finds that the DfE has breached section 10(1) of the FOIA by failing to comply with its obligations under section 1(1).
