# Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA) Decision notice

## **Decision (including any steps ordered)**

- 1. The complainant has requested information from Northumberland County Council ("the council") about the recording of formal complaints. The council responded outside the time for compliance.
- 2. The Commissioner's decision is that the council has breached section 10(1).
- 3. The Commissioner does not require any steps to be taken.

#### **Request and response**

- 4. On 8 December 2014, the complainant wrote to the council and requested information in the following terms:
  - 1) Does the Council keep a record or log of formal complaints made against it by the public?
  - 2) If so, does this log record the dates on which formal complaints are made by members of the public?
  - 3) What is the last date on which the Council has logged a formal complaint made against it by me, [redacted name]?
  - 4) How many formal complaints made against the Council by me, [redacted name], have been logged during the calendar year 2012?

- 5) How many formal complaints made against the Council by me. [redacted name], have been logged during the calendar year 2011?
- 6) How many formal complaints made against the Council by me. [redacted name], have been logged during the calendar year 2010?
- 7) How many formal complaints made against the Council by me, [redacted name], have been logged during the period between 1 January 2013 and 29 January 2013 when [redacted name] alleged in writing that "[redacted name] is a serial complainant"?
- 5. The council provided a substantive response on 29 January 2015.

### Scope of the case

- 6. The complainant wrote to the Commissioner on 24 January 2015 to complain that he had not received a response to his request. Following the council providing a response, he requested a decision notice that considered whether the council had complied with section 10.
- 7. The Commissioner therefore considers the scope of this case to be the determination of whether the council has complied with section 10.

#### Reasons for decision

#### Section 10(1) - Time for compliance

- 8. Section 10(1) requires that where a public authority has a duty under section 1(1), it must comply with that duty within twenty working days following receipt of the request.
- 9. In this case, the Commissioner has identified that the council did not respond during the time for compliance, and therefore breached section 10(1).
