Decision (including any steps ordered)

1. The complainant requested information from the Ministry of Justice (MoJ) about the cost of prison food and about the menus typically available to prisoners. To date he has not received a substantive response.
2. The Commissioner's decision is that MoJ has breached the FOIA in that it failed to provide a response to the request within the statutory timeframe of 20 working days. He requires it to comply with the request or issue a valid refusal notice as set out in section 17 of the FOIA.
3. MoJ must take these steps within 35 calendar days of the date of this decision notice. Failure to comply may result in the Commissioner making written certification of this fact to the High Court pursuant to section 54 of the Act and may be dealt with as a contempt of court.

Request and response

4. On 17 June 2015 the complainant wrote to MoJ and requested information in the following terms:

"The overall annual spend on food supplied to inmates at each of the following prisons - Cardiff, Swansea, Parc and Usk/Prescoed - in 2014-15? The average cost per prisoners per meal for breakfast, for lunch and for dinner? Please provide a sample menu of a typical week available to prisoners? Have the prison authorities sought any nutritional advice on the meals provided for patients or asked for any? If so what?"

5. MoJ acknowledged receipt of the request on 19 June 2015, but had not responded substantively by the date of this notice.

Scope of the case

6. The complainant contacted the Commissioner on 18 August 2015 to complain that he had not received a response to his request.
7. The Commissioner wrote to MoJ on 21 August 2015. He asked it to respond within 10 working days.
8. The scope of this case is the determination of whether MoJ has complied with section 10 of FOIA.

Reasons for decision

9. Section 1(1) of FOIA states that upon receipt of a request a public authority must confirm or deny whether information is held, and if that information is held it must be communicated to the requester.
10. Section 10(1) of FOIA states that public authorities must comply with section 1(1) within 20 working days of receipt of the request.
11. Despite the intervention of the Commissioner, MoJ has still not responded to the complainant's request for information.
12. From the information provided to the Commissioner in this case it is evident that MoJ did not respond to the complainant within the statutory time frame and so it is in breach of section 10(1) of the FOIA.

Other matters

13. The delay in responding to this request will be logged as part of ongoing monitoring of the MoJ's compliance with the FOIA.

Right of appeal

14. Either party has the right to appeal against this decision notice to the First-tier Tribunal (Information Rights). Information about the appeals process may be obtained from:
