

Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA) Decision notice

Date: 17 January 2018

Public Authority: Home Office

Decision (including any steps ordered)

- 1. The complainant has requested information from the Home Office regarding visa applications from outside the UK made in January, February and March 2017.
- 2. The Commissioner's decision is that the Home Office has breached section 10(1) of the FOIA as it has failed to give a substantive response to this request.
- 3. The Commissioner requires the public authority to take the following steps to ensure compliance with the legislation.
 - The Home Office must issue a response to the request in accordance with its obligations under the FOIA.
- 4. The public authority must take these steps within 35 calendar days of the date of this decision notice. Failure to comply may result in the Commissioner making written certification of this fact to the High Court pursuant to section 54 of the Act and may be dealt with as a contempt of court.



Request and response

5. On 16 September 2017, the complainant wrote to the Home Office and requested information in the following terms:

"Dear Sir of Madam,

Below is my request:

Question 1) I would be grateful if you could tell me how many visa applications from outside the UK have been made in the months of January, February and March 2017?

Question 2) How many applications identified in Question 1 paid for **Priority Visa Service** in the following four categories:

- i) Visit Visas
- ii) Points Based System visas
- iii) Other non-settlement visas
- iv) Settlement visas

Question 3) How many of the applications in Question 2 were processed within the advertised timescale for the Priority Visa Service e.g. 5 days for Priority Visa Service (non-settlement) and 15 days Settlement Priority Visa Service?"

6. The Home Office wrote to the complainant on 17 October 2017 to inform him that they were unable to send him a full response to the request within 20 working days and apologised for the delay. They advised they would send a full reply as soon as possible.

Scope of the case

- 7. The complainant contacted the Commissioner on 17 October 2017 to complain about the way his request for information had been handled.
- 8. Following receipt of the complaint the Commissioner contacted the Home Office, reminding it of its responsibilities and asking it to respond to the complainant within 10 working days.
- 9. Despite this intervention the Home Office has failed to respond to the complainant.



Reasons for decision

10. Section 10(1) of FOIA states that:

"Subject to subsections (2) and (3), a public authority must comply with section 1(1) promptly and in any event not later than the twentieth working day following the date of receipt."

11. As a response has not yet been provided by the Home Office the Commissioner finds that the Home Office has breached section 10(1) in failing to respond within 20 working days.



Right of appeal

12. Either party has the right to appeal against this decision notice to the First-tier Tribunal (Information Rights). Information about the appeals process may be obtained from:
