

Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA)

Decision notice

Decision (including any steps ordered)

- 1. The complainant has requested copies of test videos showing the use of Talon equipment from the Metropolitan Police Service (the "MPS"). To date he has not received a substantive response. The Commissioner's decision is that the MPS has breached sections 1 and 10 of the FOIA in that it has failed to provide a valid response to the request within 20 working days of receipt. She requires the MPS to comply with the request or issue a valid refusal notice as set out in section 17 of the FOIA.
- 2. The MPS must take these steps within 35 calendar days of the date of this decision notice. Failure to comply may result in the Commissioner making written certification of this fact to the High Court pursuant to section 54 of the FOIA and may be dealt with as a contempt of court.

Background

3. The request refers to Talon equipment. An article about this can be found on the MPS's website¹.

Request and response

4. On 19 September 2017 the complainant wrote to the MPS and requested information in the following terms:

"I am writing to you under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 to request the following information.

All successful test videos of the Talon equipment adopted by the Metropolitan police to help stop moving vehicles"."

- 5. On the same day the MPS acknowledged the request.
- 6. On 31 October 2017 the complainant chased a response, which was again acknowledged. He chased up his request again on 16 November 2017.

Scope of the case

- 7. The complainant contacted the Commissioner on 15 January 2018 to complain about the lack of response to his information request.
- 8. The Commissioner contacted the MPS on 8 February 2018 to query the non-response, asking for it to respond within 10 working days.
- 9. No substantive response to the request had been provided by the date of this notice.

Reasons for decision

Section 1 – general right of access Section 10 - time for compliance

- 10. Section 1(1) of the FOIA states that an individual who asks for information is entitled to be informed whether the information is held and, if the information is held, to have that information communicated to them.
- 11. Section 10(1) of the FOIA states that on receipt of a request for information a public authority should respond to the applicant within 20 working days.
- 12. From the information provided to the Commissioner in this case it is evident that the MPS did not deal with the request for information in accordance with the FOIA. In this case the MPS has breached sections 1(1) and 10(1) by failing to respond to the request within 20 working



days. The MPS is now required to respond to the request of 19 September 2017 in accordance with the FOIA.

Other matters

13. As well as finding above that the MPS is in breach of the FOIA, the Commissioner has also made a separate record of the delay in this case. This may form evidence in future enforcement action against the MPS should evidence from other cases suggest that there are systemic issues which are causing delays.



Right of appeal

14. Either party has the right to appeal against this decision notice to the First-tier Tribunal (Information Rights). Information about the appeals process may be obtained from:
