

Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA) Decision notice

Decision (including any steps ordered)

- 1. The complainant requested information from the London Borough of Croydon ("the Council") regarding the legal costs the Council has incurred in relation to a specific planning application.
- The Commissioner's decision is that the Council has failed to respond to the request within 20 working days and has therefore breached section 10 of the FOIA.
- 3. The Commissioner requires the Council to take the following steps to ensure compliance with the legislation.
 - Issue a substantive response to the request in accordance with its obligations under the FOIA.
- 4. The Council must take these steps within 35 calendar days of the date of this decision notice. Failure to comply may result in the Commissioner making written certification of this fact to the High Court pursuant to section 54 of the Act and may be dealt with as a contempt of court.



Request and response

5. On 18 March 2021, the complainant wrote to the Council via the What Do They Know website and requested information in the following terms:

"Please provide the total legal costs that Croydon Council has incurred to date in relation to planning application 19/04661/FUL including all costs relation to advise about the application, advising relation to the Certificate B, advice relation to pre-action notices served on members of the Council."

- 6. The Council wrote to the complainant on 19 March 2021 to acknowledge the request.
- 7. On 20 April 2021, as the complainant had not received a response, he wrote to the Council to ask for an update on the status of his request.
- 8. By the date of this notice the Council had not provided a substantive response to the request.

Scope of the case

- 9. The complainant contacted the Commissioner on 3 May 2021 to complain about the Council's failure to respond to his request.
- 10. The Commissioner contacted the Council on 1 June 2021 reminding it of its responsibilities and asking it to provide a substantive response to the complainant within 10 working days.
- 11. The Commissioner also contacted the complainant on 1 June 2021 to explain that the Council had been given 10 working days from that date within which to provide a response to their request.
- 12. The complainant has provided evidence that he has received an acknowledgement from the Council but, by the date of this notice, had not received a substantive response to his information request.
- 13. The scope of this notice and the following analysis is to consider whether the Council has complied with section 10 of the FOIA.



Reasons for decision

- 14. Section 1(1) of the FOIA states that:
 - Any person making a request for information to a public authority is entitled –
 - (a) To be informed in writing by the public authority whether it holds information of the description specified in the request, and
 - (b) If that is the case, to have that information communicated to him.
- 15. Section 10 of the FOIA states that responses to requests made under the Act must be provided, "*promptly and in any event not later than the twentieth working day following the date of receipt."*
- 16. The Council did not provide a substantive response to the request within 20 working days of receipt. Therefore, the Commissioner's decision is that the Council has breached section 10 of the FOIA.



Right of appeal

17. Either party has the right to appeal against this decision notice to the First-tier Tribunal (Information Rights). Information about the appeals process may be obtained from:
