

# Environmental Information Regulations 2004 (EIR) Decision notice

Date: 5 July 2021

Public Authority: Newcastle City Council Address: Civic Centre Newcastle upon Tyne NE1 8QH

## Decision (including any steps ordered)

- 1. The complainant requested information from Newcastle City Council ("the Council") regarding a Safer Bridges Scheme and the company Eljay Research Limited. The Council had failed to provide a substantive response by the date of this notice.
- 2. The Commissioner's decision is that the Council has failed to respond to the request within 20 working days and has therefore breached Regulation 5(2) of the Environmental Information Regulations ("the EIR").
- 3. The Commissioner requires the Council to take the following steps to ensure compliance with the legislation.
  - Issue a substantive response, in accordance with its obligations under the EIR, to the request.
- 4. The Council must take these steps within 35 calendar days of the date of this decision notice. Failure to comply may result in the Commissioner making written certification of this fact to the High Court pursuant to section 54 of the Freedom of Information Act and may be dealt with as a contempt of court.



### Request and response

5. On 18 April 2021, the complainant wrote to the Council and requested information in the following terms:

*"I am requesting the information listed below concerning ELJAY RESEARCH LIMITED or [Named Person] and Newcastle Council:* 

• *Minutes of meetings concerned with the Safer Bridges Scheme* 2020 – 2021 with particular reference to Stoneyhurst Rd bridge.

• Text messages concerning the Safer Bridges Scheme with particular reference to Stoneyhurst Rd bridge.

• Emails concerning the Safer Bridges Scheme with particular reference to Stoneyhurst Rd bridge.

• Contracts between the Council and ELJAY RESEARCH LIMITED and the amount paid to them from 2020.

• Details of ELJAY RESEARCH LIMITED tender for the contract named above.

- The dates that [Named Person] worked for Newcastle City Council
- The details of [Named Person]'s remit at Newcastle City Council."
- 6. The Council acknowledged the request on 20 April 2021, but had failed to provide a substantive response by the date of this notice.

# Scope of the case

- 7. The complainant contacted the Commissioner on 14 June 2021 to complain about the failure, by the Council, to respond to the request.
- 8. In line with her usual practice, the Commissioner contacted the Council on 17 June 2021 to highlight the outstanding response. She requested that the Council respond to the request within 10 working days. The correspondence was neither acknowledged nor responded to.
- 9. The scope of this notice and the following analysis is to consider whether the Council has complied with Regulation 5(2) of the EIR.

#### Reasons for decision



- 10. Regulation 2(1) of the EIR defines environmental information as being information on:
  - (a) the state of the elements of the environment, such as air and atmosphere, water, soil, land, landscape and natural sites including wetlands, coastal and marine areas, biological diversity and its components, including genetically modified organisms, and the interaction among these elements;
  - (b) factors, such as substances, energy, noise, radiation or waste, including radioactive waste, emissions, discharges and other releases into the environment, affecting or likely to affect the elements of the environment referred to in (a);
  - (c) measures (including administrative measures), such as policies, legislation, plans, programmes, environmental agreements, and activities affecting or likely to affect the elements and factors referred to in (a)...as well as measures or activities designed to protect those elements;
  - (d) reports on the implementation of environmental legislation;
  - (e) cost-benefit and other economic analyses and assumptions used within the framework of the measures and activities referred to in (c); and
  - (f) the state of human health and safety, including the contamination of the food chain, where relevant, conditions of human life, cultural sites and built structures inasmuch as they are or may be affected by the state of the elements of the environment referred to in (a) or, through those elements, by any of the matters referred to in (b) and (c);
- 11. The Commissioner has not seen the requested information but, as it is information relating to a bridge which was closed to traffic as part of a low traffic measures scheme, she believes that it is likely to be information on factors affecting or likely to affect the elements of the environment. For procedural reasons, she has therefore assessed this case under the EIR.
- 12. Regulation 5(1) states that: "a public authority that holds environmental information shall make it available on request."
- 13. Regulation 5(2) states that such information shall be made available "*as* soon as possible and no later than 20 working days after the date of receipt of the request."



14. From the evidence presented to the Commissioner in this case, it is clear that, in failing to issue a response to the request within 20 working days, the Council has breached Regulation 5(2) of the EIR

#### **Other matters**

15. The Commissioner wishes to place on record her understanding of the immense pressures placed on public authorities during the coronavirus pandemic. She is sympathetic to the difficult decisions such authorities must make, between prioritising front-line services and continuing to meet their obligations under the EIR.



# **Right of appeal**

16. Either party has the right to appeal against this decision notice to the First-tier Tribunal (Information Rights). Information about the appeals process may be obtained from:
