Environmental Information Regulations 2004 (EIR) Decision notice

Decision (including any steps ordered)

- 1. The complainant has requested a copy of a handwritten letter sent to Dover District Council (the Council) about the addition of a conservatory to the complainant's property.
- 2. The Commissioner's decision is that the FOS has correctly relied upon regulation 13(2) of EIR to withhold the information.
- 3. The Commissioner does not require further steps.

Request and response

- 4. On 17 May 2022, the complainant wrote to the Council requesting information in the following terms:
 - "Copy of handwritten letter and printed letter given to building control falsely accusing us of having building works at our property...If not possible to see copies of those letters then at least have the address of other properties mentioned including ours"
- 5. On 26 May 2022, the Council responded and refused to provide it citing regulation 12(5)(b) EIR course of justice, as its basis for doing so. Following an internal review, the Council maintained its position and in addition cited regulation 12(3) in accordance with regulation 13 personal data.

Reasons for decision

- 6. Regulation 13(1) of EIR provides an exemption for information which is the personal data of an individual other than the applicant and if its disclosure would otherwise breach any of the data protection principles.
- 7. Information will be personal data if it relates to an identifiable living individual. If the letter was disclosed, even with the name redacted it is possible that the sender may be identifiable and therefore breach the Data Protection Act.
- 8. The Commissioner has a well established position in cases such as this¹,
 ² and therefore considers the Council is entitled to rely on regulation 13
 to withhold a copy of the letter.
