

# Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA) Decision notice

# Decision (including any steps ordered)

- 1. The complainant requested information from Central Bedfordshire Council (the Council) relating to the clearing of a contractor's compound.
- 2. The Commissioner's decision is that the Council breached section 10(1) of FOIA in that it failed to provide a valid response to the request within the statutory time frame of 20 working days.
- 3. Because a response has now been provided, the Commissioner does not require the Council to take any steps.

### **Request and response**

4. On 9 August 2022, the complainant wrote to the Council and requested information in the following terms:

"Please will you inform us of the date when the contractor's compound will be completely cleared and all their items removed?"

5. The Council acknowledged the request on 11 August 2022. However, a substantive response was not provided until 11 October 2022.

## Scope of the case



- 6. The complainant contacted the Commissioner on 14 September 2022 to complain about the Council's failure to respond to their request.
- The Commissioner has considered whether the Council has complied with its obligations in relation to the time for compliance at section 10(1) of FOIA.

### **Reasons for decision**

8. Section 1(1) of FOIA states that:

"Any person making a request for information to a public authority is entitled –

(a) to be informed in writing by the public authority whether it holds information of the description specified in the request, and

(b) if that is the case, to have that information communicated to him."

- 9. Section 10(1) of FOIA states that a public authority must respond to a request promptly and "not later than the twentieth working day following the date of receipt".
- 10. From the evidence provided to the Commissioner in this case, it is clear that the Council did not deal with the request for information in accordance with FOIA. The Commissioner finds that the Council breached section 10(1) by failing to respond to the request within 20 working days.



# **Right of appeal**

11. Either party has the right to appeal against this decision notice to the First-tier Tribunal (Information Rights). Information about the appeals process may be obtained from:
