# Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA) Decision notice

Date: 16 February 2023

Public Authority: Ministry of Justice Address: 102 Petty France

London SW1H 9AJ

## **Decision (including any steps ordered)**

1. The complainant requested information from the Ministry of Justice ("the MoJ") about the cost of a court obtaining a psychiatric report.

2. The Commissioner's decision is that the MoJ breached section 10(1) of FOIA by failing to provide a valid response to the request within the statutory time frame of 20 working days. No steps are required.

## Request and response

3. On 15 August 2022, the complainant made the following request for information:

"Who funds the cost of a Court obtaining a psychiatric report on a defendant under Criminal Procedure Rule 3.10.

For example does the funding come from HMCTS or the MOJ or another organisation and how do the Court go about applying for funding for a psychiatric report on a particular defendant"

4. The MoJ responded to the request for information on 14 February 2023.

#### Scope of the case

- 5. The complainant contacted the Commissioner on 17 January 2023 to complain about the MoJ's failure to respond to their request within the statutory time frame of FOIA.
- 6. The Commissioner has considered whether the MoJ has complied with its obligations in relation to the time for compliance at section 10(1) of FOIA.

#### **Reasons for decision**

7. Section 1(1) of FOIA states that:

"Any person making a request for information to a public authority is entitled –

- (a) to be informed in writing by the public authority whether it holds information of the description specified in the request, and
- (b) if that is the case, to have that information communicated to him."
- 8. Section 10(1) of FOIA states that a public authority must respond to a request promptly and "not later than the twentieth working day following the date of receipt".
- 9. From the evidence provided to the Commissioner in this case, it is clear that the MoJ did not deal with the request for information in accordance with FOIA. The Commissioner finds that the MoJ has breached section 10(1) by failing to respond to the request within 20 working days.
