

Environmental Information Regulations 2004 (EIR) Decision notice

Date: 5 April 2023

Public Authority: London Borough of Croydon Address: Bernard Weatherill House 8 Mint Walk Croydon CR0 1EA

Decision (including any steps ordered)

- 1. The complainant requested information from the London Borough of Croydon (the Council) relating to payments made to legal professionals in connection with the ownership of a particular road. By the date of this notice the Council had not issued a substantive response to this request.
- 2. The Commissioner's decision is that the Council has failed to respond to the request within 20 working days and has therefore breached regulation 5(2) of the EIR.
- 3. The Commissioner requires the Council to take the following steps to ensure compliance with the legislation.
 - Issue a substantive response to the request in accordance with its obligations under the EIR.
- 4. The Council must take these steps within 35 calendar days of the date of this decision notice. Failure to comply may result in the Commissioner making written certification of this fact to the High Court pursuant to section 54 of the Freedom of Information Act and may be dealt with as a contempt of court.



Request and response

5. On 21 February 2023, the complainant made the following request for information to the Council:

"Please can you confirm the total legal spend by Croydon Council to Browne Jacobson LLP and any Barristers or other legal professionals engaged in matters involving Browne Jacobson LLP in relation to matters connected to the ownership of [LOCATION REDACTED] by residents via [NAME REDACTED] and/or [NAME REDACTED]. [NAME REDACTED] and [NAME REDACTED] (as well as [NAME REDACTED], are directly involved in this matter as responsible officers)."

6. To date, the Council has not acknowledged the request for information, nor provided a substantive response to the complainant.

Reasons for decision

7. Regulation 5(1) of the EIR states that:

"a public authority that holds environmental information shall make it available on request."

8. Regulation 5(2) of the EIR states that:

"Information shall be made available under paragraph (1) as soon as possible and no later than 20 working days after the date of receipt of the request."

- 9. The Commissioner contacted the Council on 24 March 2023 reminding it of its responsibilities and asking it to provide a substantive response to the complainant within 10 working days. Despite this intervention the Council has failed to respond to the complainant.
- 10. From the evidence provided to the Commissioner in this case, it is clear that the Council did not deal with the request for information in accordance with the EIR. The Commissioner's decision is that the Council has breached regulation 5(2) by failing to respond to the request within 20 working days and it is now required to respond to the request in accordance with the EIR.



Right of appeal

11. Either party has the right to appeal against this decision notice to the First-tier Tribunal (Information Rights). Information about the appeals process may be obtained from:
