Decision (including any steps ordered)

1. The complainant requested information from Chief Constable of Devon and Cornwall Police (DCP) relating to a planning statement for a firing range at Pondground Quarry. By the date of this notice DCP had not issued a substantive response to this request.
2. The Commissioner's decision is that DCP has failed to respond to the request within 20 working days and has therefore breached regulation 5(2) of the EIR.
3. The Commissioner requires DCP to take the following steps to ensure compliance with the legislation.
 - Issue a substantive response to the request in accordance with its obligations under the EIR.
4. DCP must take these steps within 35 calendar days of the date of this decision notice. Failure to comply may result in the Commissioner making written certification of this fact to the High Court pursuant to section 54 of the Freedom of Information Act and may be dealt with as a contempt of court.

Request and response

5. On 3 March 2023, the complainant made the following request for information to DCP:

"Under the Freedom of Information Act 2000, please would you provide me with the following:

- Copies of all correspondence, emails and phone records between representatives of Devon and Cornwall Police (including but not limited to the Estates Investment manager [NAME REDACTED]) and [NAME REDACTED] or any other representative of Chapman Lily Planning in relation to the Planning Statement prepared by Chapman Lily Planning for the Firing Range at Pondground Quarry, Holcombe Rogus, Devon. This includes all communication that relates to the brief for this statement, the statement itself and the final presentation of the statement dated 18th January 2023, specifically any inclusions, omissions or alterations requested by Devon and Cornwall Police."

6. To date, DCP have not acknowledged the information request.

Reasons for decision

7. Regulation 5(1) of the EIR states that:

"a public authority that holds environmental information shall make it available on request."

8. Regulation 5(2) of the EIR states that:

"Information shall be made available under paragraph (1) as soon as possible and no later than 20 working days after the date of receipt of the request."

9. The Commissioner contacted DCP on 11 May 2023 reminding it of its responsibilities and asking it to provide a substantive response to the complainant within 10 working days. Despite this intervention DCP has failed to respond to the complainant.

10. From the evidence provided to the Commissioner in this case, it is clear that DCP did not deal with the request for information in accordance with the EIR. The Commissioner's decision is that DCP has breached regulation 5(2) by failing to respond to the request within 20 working days and it is now required to respond to the request in accordance with the EIR.

Right of appeal

11. Either party has the right to appeal against this decision notice to the First-tier Tribunal (Information Rights). Information about the appeals process may be obtained from:
