Environmental Information Regulations 2004 (EIR) Decision notice

Public Authority: London Borough of Bromley

Decision (including any steps ordered)

- 1. The complainant requested information from the London Borough of Bromley (the public authority). By the date of this notice the public authority had not issued a substantive response to this request.
- 2. The Commissioner's decision is that the public authority has failed to respond to the request within 20 working days and has therefore breached regulation 5(2) of the EIR.
- 3. The Commissioner requires the public authority to take the following steps to ensure compliance with the legislation.
 - Issue a substantive response to the request in accordance with its obligations under the EIR.
- 4. The public authority must take these steps within 35 calendar days of the date of this decision notice. Failure to comply may result in the Commissioner making written certification of this fact to the High Court pursuant to section 54 of the Freedom of Information Act and may be dealt with as a contempt of court.

Request and response

5. On 11 June 2023, the complainant made the following request for information to the public authority:

"What evidence do you have that the unmade part of Westgate Road was shown as a Byway Open to all Traffic on a Definition Map and Statement immediately before the commencement of the Countryside and Rights of Way Act 2000 or that an application was made before 20 January 2005 to add it to the Definitive Map? Please provide copies of any such evidence including the date, method of data acquisition, and the source from which it arose."

Reasons for decision

6. Regulation 5(1) of the EIR states that:

"a public authority that holds environmental information shall make it available on request."

7. Regulation 5(2) of the EIR states that:

"Information shall be made available under paragraph (1) as soon as possible and no later than 20 working days after the date of receipt of the request."

- 8. The Commissioner contacted the public authority on 22 September 2023 reminding it of its responsibilities and asking it to provide a substantive response to the complainant within 10 working days. Despite this intervention the public authority has failed to respond to the complainant.
- 9. From the evidence provided to the Commissioner in this case, it is clear that the public authority did not deal with the request for information in accordance with the EIR. The Commissioner's decision is that the public authority has breached regulation 5(2) by failing to respond to the request within 20 working days and it is now required to respond to the request in accordance with the EIR.
