# Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA) Decision notice

## **Decision (including any steps ordered)**

- 1. The complainant has requested information regarding two misconduct hearings. Derbyshire Constabulary relied on section 40(2) of FOIA (third party personal information) to withhold the information.
- 2. The Commissioner's decision is that Derbyshire Constabulary has correctly relied on section 40(2) of FOIA to withhold the information.
- 3. The Commissioner does not require further steps to be taken.

#### **Request and response**

4. On 13 August 2023, the complainant wrote to Derbyshire Constabulary and requested information in the following terms:

"Please send me copies of the outcome notices of misconduct proceedings for officers [name redacted] and [name redacted], who are both on the College of Policing's Barred List:

I would like the documents in Portable Document Format (.PDF)..."

5. Derbyshire Constabulary responded on 21 August 2023. It stated that the requested information was exempt from disclosure under section 40(2).

6. Following an internal review, Derbyshire Constabulary wrote to the complainant on 4 September 2023. It stated that it was upholding its original decision.

#### Scope of the case

- 7. The complainant contacted the Commissioner on 29 September 2023 to complain about the way their request for information had been handled.
- 8. The Commissioner considers that the scope of his investigation is to establish whether Derbyshire Constabulary is entitled to withhold the requested information under section 40(2) of the FOIA

#### Reasons for decision

### Section 40 - personal information

- 9. The Commissioner has previously considered a separate request from the same complainant for similar information, involving similar circumstances but for a different police force.
- 10. Rather than reproduce the rationale applied in that case, the Commissioner is relying on the same considerations for this complaint.
- 11. The related case is IC-264178-D7D2, which may be found on the Commissioner's website<sup>1</sup>.
- 12. It follows that Derbyshire Constabulary was entitled to rely on section 40(2) to withhold the requested information.

#### Right of appeal

13. Either party has the right to appeal against this decision notice to the First-tier Tribunal (Information Rights). Information about the appeals process may be obtained from:
