

# Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA) Decision notice

Date: 12 April 2024

**Public Authority: Chief Constable of Staffordshire Police** 

Address: Police Headquarters

#### **Decision (including any steps ordered)**

1. The complainant requested information from Staffordshire Police (the public authority). By the date of this notice the public authority had not issued a substantive response to this request.

- 2. The Commissioner's decision is that the public authority has breached section 10(1) of FOIA in that it failed to provide a valid response to the request within the statutory time frame of 20 working days.
- 3. The Commissioner requires the public authority to take the following step to ensure compliance with the legislation.
  - The public authority must provide a substantive response to the request in accordance with its obligations under FOIA.<sup>1</sup>
- 4. The public authority must take this step within 35 calendar days of the date of this decision notice. Failure to comply may result in the Commissioner making written certification of this fact to the High Court pursuant to section 54 of FOIA and may be dealt with as a contempt of court.

### **Request and response**

5. On 15 February 2024, the complainant wrote to the public authority and requested information in the following terms:

"For each of the last ten calendar years (January 1<sup>st</sup> 2014 31 December 2023):

- Q1) How many police buildings (and or land) have been sold? Please list them (and advise what they were previously used for, for example if they were a police station or land used for car storage) and advise how much they were sold for. If land only, please advise the size.
- Q2) What buildings or land owned by the Force are currently up for sale? Please provide a list.
- Q3) Broadly, of the funds raised, what has this money been used for?"

#### Reasons for decision

6. Section 1(1) of FOIA states that:

"Any person making a request for information to a public authority is entitled –

- (a) to be informed in writing by the public authority whether it holds information of the description specified in the request, and
- (b) if that is the case, to have that information communicated to him."
- 7. Section 10(1) of FOIA states that a public authority must respond to a request promptly and "not later than the twentieth working day following the date of receipt".
- 8. On 9 April 2024 the Commissioner wrote to the public authority, reminding it of its responsibilities and asking it to provide a substantive response to the complainant's request within 10 working days.
- 9. The public authority responded to the Commissioner on 12 April 2024 to inform him that, due to resource issues, it would not be able to provide a response to the request by the 10 working day deadline that he had set.
- 10. From the evidence provided to the Commissioner in this case, it is clear that the public authority did not deal with the request for information in



accordance with FOIA. The Commissioner finds that the public authority has breached section 10(1) by failing to respond to the request within 20 working days and it is now required to respond to the request in accordance with FOIA.



## Right of appeal

11. Either party has the right to appeal against this decision notice to the First-tier Tribunal (Information Rights). Information about the appeals process may be obtained from:
