DECISION

- 1 Patents Form 2/77 names two inventors, Dean Corrigan and Victoria Louise O'Donoghue.
- Dean Corrigan, the current patent applicant, has made an application under section 13(3) of the Act to the effect that Victoria Louise O'Donoghue should not have been mentioned as an inventor.
- Victoria Louise O'Donoghue has confirmed in writing that she should not have been mentioned as an inventor. I therefore conclude that the relevant parties agree that Victoria Louise O'Donoghue should not have been mentioned as a joint inventor in the published patent application.
- Accordingly I find that Victoria Louise O'Donoghue should not have been mentioned as a joint inventor in the published patent application. This decision, issued in accordance with section 13(3), serves as a certificate to this effect. I also direct than an addendum slip be prepared stating that Victoria Louise O'Donoghue should not have been mentioned as a joint inventor.
