DECISION

- European Patent (UK) 1425031 names four inventors, Peter G Lerch, Roberto Paterno, Alphonse Hubsch and G. Markus Lang.
- 2 CSL Behring AG, the current patent proprietor, has made an application under section 13(3) of the Act to the effect that Peter G Lerch and Roberto Paterno should not have been mentioned as inventors.
- Peter G Lerch and Roberto Paterno have confirmed in a written declaration that they should not have been mentioned as inventors. For their part, Alphonse Hubsch, G. Markus Lang and CSL Behring AG have countersigned this declaration confirming that Peter G Lerch and Roberto Paterno should not have been mentioned as inventors. I therefore conclude that all relevant parties agree that Peter G Lerch and Roberto Paterno should not have been mentioned as joint inventors in the EP (UK) granted patent.

Accordingly I find that Peter G Lerch and Roberto Paterno should not have been mentioned as joint inventors in the EP (UK) granted patent. This decision, issued in accordance with section 13(3), serves as a certificate to this effect. I also direct that an addendum slip be prepared stating that Peter G Lerch and Roberto Paterno should not have been mentioned as joint inventors
