The result is that the Appeal ought to be dismissed, and their Lordships will therefore humbly advise Her Majesty to that effect.

The Appellants must pay the costs of the Appeal; but their Lordships observe that in this record, as in many others that come before them, there is matter introduced which could not possibly have any bearing upon the question raised by the Appeal. There is a map of the district of Bhagulpore, which is nothing but a copy of a public map. It is not an estate map, and even if it were it would be difficult to see how it could bear on the question involved in this Appeal. There are also nearly 30 pages of jummabundi accounts, and it is impossible to understand how those could have had any bearing upon the Appeal. Therefore, in the taxation of the costs, their Lordships desire that the Registrar shall disallow all such as have been occasioned by the introduction of irrelevant matter.
