Their Lordships have listened to very careful and useful arguments by the appellants' counsel in support of this appeal, but they find themselves quite unable to advise His Majesty that the appeal should be allowed. In substance it can only succeed if it is possible for the appellants to show that, upon some ground well known to the law, the award that is the subject matter of the whole dispute can be successfully impeached. Their Lordships are unable to find that any adequate reason is given in support of that view and they will, therefore, humbly advise His Majesty that the judgment of the High Court should be affirmed and this appeal dismissed. The respondents have not appeared before the Board, but they have incurred certain costs including the lodgment of their printed case, and these must be paid by the appellants.
