The very fact of this opposition makes it desirable that their Lordships should determine the point once for all.

There is no doubt about the terms of the compromise in this case. There are some means by which an agreement of compromise may be set aside—fraud, or something like that may be proved—and if the parties who are No. 26 respondents in this case think that such a case can be made they will make it, but, unless they can make some such case as that, the compromise stands, and the compromise in their Lordships' view is the one set out on page 71 of the record and not that deposed to by Mr. Sampson in his affidavit.

That being so, their Lordships will humbly recommend to His Majesty that a supplemental order in this case be made directing that this compromise be filed.

Each party must bear its own costs.
