EQUIPMENT LEASE AGREEMENT

THIS LEASE AGREEMENT made this 13th day of April One thousand nine hundred and seventynine (1979). Between UNITED ORIENT LEASING COMPANY SDN. BHD. a company incorporated in Malaysia and having an office at 2nd Floor, Bangunan Dato Zainal, No. 23 Jalan Melaka, Kuala Lumpur (hereinafter called "the Lessor" which expression shall include its successorsin-title and assigns) of the one part And Emporium President & Supermarket Sdn. Bhd. a company incorporated in Malaysia and having a business office at Johor Tower, 15 Jalan Greja, Johor Bahru, Johor (hereinafter called "the Lessee" which expression shall include its successors-in-title and permitted assigns) of the other part.

WHEREAS at the request of the Lessee the Lessor has agreed to purchase/has purchased the equipment hereinafter described for the purpose of leasing the same to the Lessee upon the terms and conditions hereinafter appearing.

NOW THEREFORE THIS AGREEMENT WITNESSETH that for and in consideration of the mutual covenants and premises hereinafter set forth, the parties hereto agree as follows:-

Article 1. (Leased Equipment)

Article 4. (Renewal of Agreement)

In the event that the Lessee, not less than two months prior to the expiration of the Initial Term makes a written request to the Lessor for renewal of this Lease Agreement and if at such time and until the expiry of the Initial Term there shall be no breach by the Lessee of the terms and conditions herein contained the Lessor shall continue to lease the Equipment to the Lessee on the same terms and conditions as herein contained (save and except there shall be no further provision for renewal) PROVIDED HOWEVER that:-

- (a) the period (hereinafter called "the Renewed Term") of the renewal lease shall be for one (1) year commencing immediately after the expiry of the Initial Term, unless otherwise agreed upon between the parties hereto in writing;
- (b) the rental payable shall be the amount as stipulated in Item (8) of the Schedule; and
- (c) the Agreed Loss Value shall be as stipulated in Item (10) of the Schedule.

Article 5. (Delivery of Equipment)

(1) The Lessee shall inspect the Equipment and issue to the Lessor an Acceptance Receipt (hereinafter called "the Acceptance Receipt") therefor in such form as may be required by the Lessor not later than the date stipulated in Item (4) of the Schedule and after receipt of the Equipment either from the seller named in Item (2) of the Schedule (hereinafter called "the Seller") or from the Lessor as the case may be.

(2) The Lessee may commence using the Equipment in accordance with the provisions of this Lease Agreement from the date the Lessee issued to the Lessor the Acceptance Receipt pursuant to the provisions of the preceding paragraph.

(3) (a) In the event that the Lessee discovers any defects in the Equipment or has any complaints in respect thereof the Lessee shall immediately notify the Lessor thereof and specifically state such defects and complaints in the Acceptance Receipt provided that nothing in this clause shall be construed to imply that the Lessor is liable or responsible for such defects and complaints.

(b) In the event of the Lessee failing to so notify the Lessor in accordance with paragraph 3(a) of this Article the Lessee hereby agrees that it shall be deemed that the Equipment has been delivered in perfect condition and that the Lessee shall not raise any objections whatsoever thereafter.

(4) If pursuant to this Lease Agreement it shall be necessary to do so, the Lessor shall exercise its best efforts to make arrangements with the Seller so that the Equipment can be delivered to the Lessee by the expected date of delivery as described in Item (4) of the Schedule. In the event that the Lessor is unable to make such arrangements for delivery with the Seller the Lessor shall notify the Lessee to that effect and discuss with the Lessee the possibility of making substitute arrangements. If the Lessor and the Lessee are unable to agree on such substitute arrangements within fourteen (14) days after such aforesaid notice by the Lessor either the Lessor or the Lessee shall be entitled to terminate this Lease Agreement and upon such termination this Lease Agreement shall be null and void and of no effect and neither the Lessor nor the Lessee shall be held responsible for such termination and neither the Lessor nor the Lessee shall have any claims against the other.

<u>Article 6</u>. (Defects in Equipment)

(1) The Lessee, having negotiated with the Seller and having on its own accord selected the Equipment for its own use, hereby acknowledges and declares that the Lessor shall not be responsible for any delay in delivery or non-delivery by the Seller of the Equipment or for any defects or for the quality or fitness of the Equipment or any part or parts thereof.

(2) In the event that the Lessee suffers any damages in consequence of any delay in delivery or non-delivery of or any defect in or quality of or unfitness of the Equipment and the Lessee having duly signed the Acceptance Receipt in accordance with Article 5(1) hereof the Lessor agrees to assign to the Lessee (at the Lessee's own cost and expense) whatever rights the Lessor may have if any to seek such compensation for damages from the Seller provided High Court No. 3 Affidavit of Ng Seng Huat and Exhibits thereto affirmed 23rd October 1979 (Continued)

Article 7. (Custody and Use of Equipment)

(1) In the event that the Lessor instructs the Lessee to affix labels, plates or other markings on the Equipment to indicate that the Equipment is owned by the Lessor the Lessee shall forthwith at its own cost and expense follow such instructions.

The Lessee shall at its own cost and expenses at all times:-

(1) Without the written consent of the Lessor the Lessee shall not make any additions, improvements or alterations to the Equipment or changes of the working order, function or quality thereof.

(2) If the Lessee does make additions or alterations to or improve the Equipment without the prior written consent of the Lessor, the Lessee shall immediately upon being required so to do by the Lessor remove the same and reinstate the Equipment 40 to its original state at the Lessee's cost and expense.

(3) Any additions, improvements or alterations made to the Equipment (whether or not with the Lessor's consent) shall be deemed to form part of the Equipment 30

(Equipment not to be affixed to premises)

(1) Without the Lessor's written consent the Lessee shall not affix, secure, fasten, anchor or in any way attach the Equipment to the premises in which the Equipment is kept and used or to any immovable property.

(2) In the event that the Lessee seeks the Lessor's consent referred to in the preceding paragraph of this Article, the Lessee shall submit a written consent or a certificate from the owner or landlord of such premises or immovable property to the effect that such owner or landlord agrees not to treat the Equipment as a fixture or fitting forming a part of such premises or immovable property and as between the Lessor and the Lessee the Equipment hereby leased shall remain personal property and shall continue in the ownership of the Lessor notwithstanding that the same may have been affixed to any land or building as aforesaid. (3) The Lessee hereby undertakes to the Lessor that it will duly and punctually pay all rents and rates, assessments, taxes and other outgoings payable in respect of the premises where the Equipment may for the time being be placed stored and/or used and shall produce to the Lessor on demand the receipt or receipts for the then latest payment due in respect thereof.

<u>Article 11</u>. (Prohibition of Transfer, etc. of Equipment)

Article 15. (Receipt of Insurance Proceeds)

The Deposit shall be maintained at the same amount during the term of the Lease Agreement and shall not be treated as payment of the Rent or any part thereof and the same shall be returned to the Lessee free of interest on the termination of the Lease Agreement less such sums as may then be due to the Lessor under the terms of the Lease Agreement but without prejudice to any other claims which the Lessor may have against the Lessee under the terms of the Lease Agreement.

EQUIPMENT LEASE AGREEMENT

THIS LEASE AGREEMENT made this 2nd day of May One thousand nine hundred and seventy-nine (1979) Between UNITED ORIENT LEASING COMPANY SDN. BHD. a company incorporated in Malaysia and having an office at 2nd Floor, Bangunan Dato Zainal, No. 23 Jalan Melaka, Kuala Lumpur (hereinafter called "the Lessor" which expression shall include its successors-intitle and assigns) of the one part And Emporium President & Supermarket Sdn. Bhd. a company incorporated in Malaysia and having a business office at Johor Tower, 15 Jalan Greja, Johor Bahru, Johor, (hereinafter called "the Lessee" which expression shall include its successors-in-title and permitted assigns) of the other part.

WHEREAS at the request of the Lessee the Lessor has agreed to purchase/has purchased the equipment hereinafter described for the purpose of leasing the same to the Lessee upon the terms and conditions hereinafter appearing.

NOW THEREFORE THIS AGREEMENT WITNESSETH that for and in consideration of the mutual covenants and premises hereinafter set forth, the parties hereto agree as follows:-

<u>Article 1</u>. (Leased Equipment)

The Lessor hereby agrees to lease and let to the Lessee and the Lessee hereby agrees to take on lease and hire/takes on lease and hire from the Lessor the equipment (hereinafter called "the Equipment" which expression shall be deemed to include all replacements and renewals thereof and all accessories and additions thereto whether made before or after the date of this Lease Agreement) more particularly described in Item (1) of the schedule attached hereto which schedule shall be deemed a part of this Lease Agreement (hereinafter called "the Schedule") for the period upon the terms and conditions herein set forth and SUBJECT ALWAYS to the due and punctual payment of the rent hereinafter mentioned and the due observance and performance of the covenants and conditions herein contained by the Lessee.

JUDGMENT OF ANNUAR, J.

This is an application by way of Originating Motion by United Orient Leasing Company Sendirian Berhad (the Applicants) for an Order that :- "All the goods and chattels stated in the Schedule annexed hereto belonging to the Applicants and seized by the Bailiff under Distress Suit No. 12 of 1979 in the Honourable Court at the premises of Emporium President and Supermarket Sdn. Bhd. in Johor Tower, Johor Bahru, be released forthwith to the Applicants."

The facts of the case are thus. The Applicants leased out to Emporium President and Supermarket Sdn. Bhd. (the Emporium) a few items of goods and chattels (the said goods) described fully in the Lease Agreement dated 13th August, 1979 and 2nd May, The Emporium suffered execution in the 1979. Subordinate Courts in Johor Bahru on 3rd September, The respondent caused to be issued a Warrant 1979. of Distress against the Emporium for arrears of rent in High Court Distress Suit No. 12/79 dated 19th September, 1979. In view of section 20(1) of the Distress Ordinance 1951 no seizure could be effected on the goods in the Emporium. The Warrant of Distress however was served on the Bailiff of the Subordinate Court who was in possession of the property under the execution order. The applicants filed an objection in the Subordinate Court and the goods were released to the Applicants by the learned President on 22nd October 1979. The property therefore were deemed to have been attached or seized under the Warrant of Distress No. 12/79. Order 46(a) rule 2(3) of the Rules of Supreme Court applied.

The respondent then made an application by 0.M. 31/79 and obtained an order for the matter to be transferred to the High Court. The Court ordered that the High Court receive and realise all the goods attached and seized at the premises of the Emporium. The Court also fixed a date for the auction of the said goods.

The Applicants then filed the present action to 40 have the goods released.

> At the hearing of the Motion the Learned Counsel for the Applicants submitted that in the first place the seizure is wrongful and bad in law and secondly that the said goods did not belong to the Emporium and were therefore wrongly seized.

I will deal with the question of seizure first.

Under section 20(1) of the Distress Ordinance, 1951 any property liable to be seized under a Warrant of Distress which has already been seized in execution of an Order by any Court shall not be seized again. In the <u>High Court</u>

15th November 1979 (Continued) But a Warrant of Distress may be served on an officer in possession of the property under execution order. The officer shall then be liable to pay out of the proceeds of the sale of the goods seized by him to the landlord.

It was argued that under section 20 of the Ordinance the landlord cannot levy execution of property which has already been executed or seized by an Order of any Court and that the landlord's only right is the payment out of sales of the property. 10

It has also been aruged that Order 46(1) rule 2(1) of the Rules of Supreme Court does not apply to cases of Warrant of Distress. It was submitted that since Order 46(2) rule 2(1) speaks of "property attached by way of execution" it does not include a Warrant of Distress. The Applicants' contention was that "execution" is an Order after judgment has been given by the Court and it does not include "distrain" by a landlord. For that reason it was argued that Order 46(a) rule 2(3) of the Rules of the Supreme Court would not apply. Order 46(a) rule 2(3) provides that :-

> "If the property is released from prior attachment, it shall be deemed to have been attached and seized under subsequent order or warrant."

With respect I am unable to agree with the submission by the learned counsel for the Applicants. Looking at sub-section (3) of section 20 of the Distress Ordinance it is clear that when notice of Warrant of Distress has been served on an officer in possession of the property attached by way of execution it is open for the execution creditor or execution debtor to apply to the Court to discharge or suspend the Warrant of Distress. It means that the serving of the Warrant of Distress on the officer in possession of the property has the effect of the property being attached or seized. There is therefore no necessity for the Warrant of Distress to be re-executed on the property if the property is released from the prior I am of the view that section 20 of attachment. the Distress Ordinance 1951 read together with Order 46a Rule 2 have effect as an attachment and therefore Order 46(a) rule 3 would apply.

The applicant's application is made under section 10(c) of the Distress Ordinance 1951. The Applicants have to satisfy the Court that the immediate tenant i.e. the Emporium, has no right of property or beneficial interest in the said goods. There is no dispute as to the ownership. The Applicants have satisfied the Court that the Emporium has no right of 20

property or beneficial interest in the said goods. However the provision of section 10 would not apply if the said goods fall under any of the categories of goods under section 12. Among other things section 10 does not apply to goods in the possession, order, or disposition of such tenant by the consent and permission of the true owner under such circumstances that such tenant is the reputed owner thereof. Section 12(1) reads:- In the High Court

"The provision of section 10 shall not apply:-

(1) to goods belonging to to goods in the possession, order or disposition of such tenant by the consent and permission of the true owner under such circumstances that such tenant is the reputed owner thereof."

The Manager of the Applicants in his affidavit of 23rd October 1979 stated that the said goods were leased out to the Emporium by two Lease agreements dated 13th April 1979 and 2nd May 1979. The Emporiums were in breach of the agreements by not paying the rental punctually. Accordingly the Applicants by letter dated 30th September 1979 gave notice of assumption of immediate possession of the said goods pursuant to Article 21(6) of the said Lease agreement.

It should be observed that on 3rd September 1979 the said goods were attached by execution of an Order of the Court. On that date the Emporium was still in possession of the said goods. These facts to my mind show that the goods were in such a situation as to convey to the minds of those who know their situation the reputation of ownership.

In Re Coulton, Ex p. Watkings, Lord Selbourne, L.C. discussed at length "reputed owner".

"... The doctrine of reputed ownership does require any investigation into the actual state of knowledge or belief, either of all creditors, or of particular creditors, and still less of the outside world, who are no creditors at all, as to the position of the It is enough for the particular goods. doctrine if these goods are in such a situation as to convey to the minds of those who know their situation the reputation of ownership. that reputation arising by the legitimate exercise of reason and judgment on the knowledge of those facts which are capable of being generally known to those who choose to make inquiry on the subject. It is not at all necessary to examine into the degree of

15th November 1979 (Continued) actual knowledge which is possessed, but the Court must judge from the situation of the goods what inference as to ownership might be legitimately drawn by those who know the facts"

In the present case the goods were in the possession of the Emporium at the time when they were seized by the Court. The only legitimate inference that could be drawn from this is that the Emporium is the reputed owner thereof. This being the case the goods fall under the categories of goods listed in section 12 and therefore section 10 does not apply.

The application is dismissed with costs.

MEMORANDUM OF APPEAL

United Orient Leasing Company Sdn. Bhd., the Appellants abovenamed, appeal to the Federal Court against the whole of the decision of the Honourable Mr. Justice Anuar bin Dato Zainal Abidin given at Johore Bahru on the 15th day of November 1979 on the following grounds :

- 1. The said decision was wrong in law and against the weight of evidence.
- 2. The learned judge ought to have made an order directing the Respondents to release the goods of the Appellants wrongfully attached by the Respondents in the Distress Suit No. 12 of 1979 to the Appellants because the Appellants were and are so entitled in law.
- 3. Alternatively, the learned Judge ought to have made such order in the proper exercise of his discretion.

- The learned Judge erred in law in holding 4. that the goods were in the reputed ownership of Emporium President and Supermarket Sdn. Bhd. (the Emporium) merely because they were in its possession on the 3rd September 1979 when they came under execution by a judgment creditor (not the Respondents) The in the Johore Bahru Sessions Court. learned Judge failed to consider the undisputed fact that this judgment creditor and other judgement creditors had all acknowledged the title of the Appellants to these goods and had all released the goods to the Appellants.
- 5. The learned Judge erred in law in failing to consider and give effect to the undisputed fact that the notice of 3rd September 1979 as stated by the learned Judge served on the Emporium on 3rd September 1979 before attachment of the goods by the Respondents on 22nd October 1979, had terminated the lease agreements, and the consent or permission of the Appellants as owners had therefore been withdrawn.
- 6. The learned Judge ought to have held that from the undisputed facts the Respondents had wrongfully seized the goods from the possession of the Appellants on 22nd October 1979 after the goods had been delivered to the Appellants by the Bailiff of the Sessions Court, Johore Bahru.
- 7. The learned Judge erred in law in holding that the Emporium was the reputed owner of the goods when at all material times the Respondents themselves or their solicitors knew and did not dispute that the goods in fact belonged to the Appellants.

8. The learned Judge erred in law in completely failing to consider and give effect to the undisputed fact that the custom of emporiums and supermarkets to lease such goods by itself would exclude the doctrine of reputed ownership, with the legal consequence that the goods were not liable to attachment or seizure and sale by the Respondents.

JUDGMENT OF THE COURT

On 3rd September, 1979 the Sessions Court at Johor Bahru levied an execution order against an emporium. Among the goods and chattels seized were refrigerators, bakery and coffee house equipments, scales, labelling machines, kiddie ride machines and cash registers found on the premises. The appellants claimed that these equipments belonged to them. On the same day they gave the emporium notice of assumption of the equipments.

20

On 4th September, 1979 the respondents took out a warrant of distress in the High Court and distrained the goods already under seizure by the Sessions Court. On application by the appellants, the learned trial Judge, after a hearing on 19th September, 1979 discharged the warrant on the ground, it has been indicated, that no order had been obtained for the issue of warrant of distress and seizure of the equipments was wrongful under s.20(1) of the Distress Ordinance, 1951. On the same day, i.e. 19th September, 1979 the respondents caused the present warrant of distress to be issued against the emporium. The Warrant was served on the Bailiff of the Sessions Court.

On 22nd October, 1979 the Sessions Court after hearing an objection by the appellants against seizure of the equipments ordered that they be released to the appellants. But the High Court on 15th November, 1979 dismissed the appellants' motion for release of the equipments distrained under the present warrant of distress holding in effect that the equipments had been in such situation in the premises of the emporium that the emporium was the reputed owner.

In dealing with this appeal against the above decision, there is little need to discuss the various arguments raised and authorities cited. The case rests mainly on interpretation of the particular facts. It needs only to be determined whether on the evidence the findings of the learned trial Judge can be sustained.

So far as relevant to the present case, section 10 of the Distress Ordinance, 1951 contains power enabling a Judge to release a distrained article seized under a warrant of distress issued to recover rent if the applicant satisfies the Court that the tenant had no right to property in a distrained article. But s.12(1) created exceptions. The exception applicable here is that which relates to goods in the possession of a tenant by the consent and permission of the true owner under such circumstances that such tenant is the reputed owner.

There were two affidavits deposing as to facts.

By an affidavit dated 23rd October, 1979 the appellants' manager said that the equipments belonged to the appellants and were leased to the emporium under lease agreements of 13th April, 1979 and 2nd May 1979; that the appellants by letter on 3rd September, 1979 gave the emporium notice of assumption of immediate possession of the equipments; and that on 26th September, 1979 and 27th September, 1979 the solicitors for the respondents in the warrant of In the Federal Court

2nd April 1980 (Continued) distress and in this appeal and who also acted for the executing creditors in the Sessions Court wrote to the Registrar, Sessions Court, stating that the equipments belonged to the appellants and asked that they be released to the appellants.

A director of the respondents by an affidavit in reply of 10th November, 1979 said that the respondents had always been under the impression that the equipments in the premises belonged to the emporium, the two lease agreements were in fact agreements of purchase by the appellants of the equipments and then leasing them back to the emporium.

The learned trial judge's findings which led him to the conclusion that the emporium was the reputed owner read as follows:

> "It should be observed that on 3rd September, 1979 the said goods were attached by execution of an Order of the Court. On that date the Emporium was still in possession of the said goods. These facts to my mind show that the goods were in such a situation as to convey to the minds of those who know their situation the reputation of ownership."

The points to note here are that on 3rd September, 1979 the emporium was in possession of the equipments, when the Sessions Court attached them. It was also found that the appellants gave notice of assumption, which should have been on 3rd September, 1979, and not on 30th September, 1979, having regard to the appellants' affidavit, which was not disputed by the respondents.

It may be accepted that in the circumstances, the notice of assumption at the time it was given could have been for the purpose of forestalling We are also of the view seizure by the Court. that under ordinary circumstances the fact that the appellants gave notice of assumption of property without taking any positive steps to recover possession did not erase reputed ownership by the emporium at the time. The law appears to be that even if there is a termination of agreement, goods remaining in the possession of the tenant may still be within the reputed ownership of the tenant and liable to distress. But in the present case, there are other circumstances which should have been considered.

Although as at 3rd September, 1979 the emporium could be considered to be the reputed owner, the Sessions Court took over possession by the execution order, and the effective warrant of distress was 20

only taken out on the 19th September, 1979. The material date to determine such possession as to make a tenant the reputed owner of a distrained article is immediately before and at the issue of the warrant of distress. The question which should be considered is whether after the 3rd September, 1979 the emporium continued to be in such possession of the equipments under such circumstances that the emporium was still the reputed owner.

The evidence shows there was a change of circumstances brought about by the following events. On 4th September, 1979 the respondents took out the first warrant of distress and apparently also distrained the equipments already under seizure by the Sessions Court the previous day. On application by the appellants, the learned trial Judge, after a hearing on 19th September, 1979, discharged the warrant on the ground indicated above. On this date when the respondents took out the present warrant of distress, they must have been aware of the full circumstances surrounding the equipments: the appellants had given notice of assumption of The appellants were in no position the equipments. to take steps to assume possession as the equipments were under attachment by the Sessions Court. By the notice it must be taken that the appellants as the true owners of the equipments had withdrawn consent and permission from the emporium being in possession of the equipments and were claiming them. There is nothing to show that the respondents were not aware of this notice even when they took out the warrant of distress on 4th September, 1979. The indications are that the incorrect finding that this notice was given on 30th September, 1979, instead of 3rd September, 1979 must have led the trial Court to conclude that up to 30th September, 1979, well after the present warrant of distress, the emporium still had possession of the equipments, subject to the Sessions Court attachment. Further, what is crucial to the appellants' right is that when the present warrant of distress came up for hearing on 15th November, 1979, the solicitors of the respondents had already on 26th or 27th September, 1979 acknowledged that the equipments belonged to the appellants and requested the Sessions Court to release them to the appellants. The acknowledgment must be taken to relate back to the date of attachment and is a complete admission that the appellants were entitled to the equipments and the emporium had no right to possession. Nowhere in the judgment, did the learned trial Judge advert to this admission.
