The A66 Trunk Road (Bowes Moor) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2010

 Made
 23 August 2010

 Coming into force
 5 September 2010

WHEREAS, the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the A66 Trunk Road, in the County of Durham, is satisfied that traffic on that trunk road should be prohibited because environmental works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14(1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), makes the following Order: -

- **1.** This Order may be cited as the A66 Trunk Road (Bowes Moor) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2010 and shall come into force on 5 September 2010.
- **2.** In this Order "a layby" means an area of carriageway, situated adjacent to the A66 Trunk Road eastbound carriageway approximately 970 metres east of the Cumbrian Border or approximately 4260 metres east of the Cumbrian Border, intended for the waiting of vehicles, bounded partly by a road marking on the outer edge of that carriageway complying with diagram 1010 in Schedule 6 to the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002(**b**); and in this definition "carriageway" means any way (other than a cycle track) over which the public have a right of way for the passage of vehicles and which has a surface suitable for the exercise of that right.
- **3.** Subject as mentioned in article 4 of this Order no person shall, during a period starting at 00:01 hours on Monday 6 September 2010 and ending when the said works have been completed, cause or permit any vehicle to enter or wait in a layby.
- **4.**The provisions of article 3 of this Order shall apply only during such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs and shall not apply to:
 - (a) a vehicle being used for police, fire and rescue authority or ambulance purposes;
 - (b) a vehicle being used for, or in connection with, the said works, or for winter maintenance or traffic officer purposes; or
 - (c) anything done at the direction of, or with the permission of, a constable or traffic officer in uniform
