ROAD TRAFFIC

The M1 Motorway (Junctions 20 – 19) (Temporary Restriction and Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2010

Made----18 October 2010Coming into force--25 October 2010

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the M1 Motorway ("the M1") and connecting roads, is satisfied that traffic on a length of that motorway and two of those connecting roads in the County of Leicestershire should be restricted and prohibited because works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14 (1)(a) and (7) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(**a**), and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby makes the following Order:-

1. This Order may be cited as the M1 Motorway (Junctions 20 - 19) (Temporary Restriction and Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2010 and shall come into force on 25 October 2010.

2. In this Order –

"the motorway"	junction	e southbound carriageway of the M1 from its with the exit slip road at Junction 20 to its with the exit slip road at Junction 19;
"the slip road"	means the slip road leading-	
	(i)	from the southbound carriageway of the M1 to the depot at Misterton: and
	(ii)	to the southbound carriageway of the M1 from the depot at Misterton;
"the Regulations"		he Motorways Traffic (England and Wales) ons 1982(b);

"a hard shoulder"	means the hard shoulder, within the meaning of Regulation $3(1)(e)$ of the Regulations, which is adjacent to the motorway;
"the works period"	means the period starting at 20:00 hours on Monday 1 November 2010 and ending when the said works have been completed;

and a reference to an article followed by a number is a reference to the article in this Order which bears that number.

3. Subject as mentioned in articles 5 and 6, no person shall, during the works period, drive any motor vehicle at a speed exceeding 50 miles per hour in the motorway.

4. Subject as mentioned in articles 5 and 6, no person shall, during the works period, cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed in the motorway or a slip road.

5. The provisions of articles 3 and 4 shall apply only during such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs.

6. The provisions of articles 3 and 4 shall not apply to any vehicle –

- (a) being used for police, fire brigade or ambulance purposes; or
- (b) proceeding at the direction of, or with the permission of, a police constable or traffic officer in uniform;

and nothing in article 4 shall apply to any vehicle being used for or in connection with the said works or by a traffic officer in uniform.

7. During the works period, regulations 5 and (in so far as it relates to a vehicle being driven) 9 of the Regulations are hereby suspended in respect of a hard shoulder, at such times and to such extent as may from time to time be indicated by traffic signs.
