**The M1 Motorway (Junctions 20 – 19)
(Temporary Restriction and Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2010**

Made - - - - 18 October 2010

Coming into force - - 25 October 2010

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the M1 Motorway (“the M1”) and connecting roads, is satisfied that traffic on a length of that motorway and two of those connecting roads in the County of Leicestershire should be restricted and prohibited because works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14 (1)(a) and (7) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby makes the following Order:-

1. This Order may be cited as the M1 Motorway (Junctions 20 - 19) (Temporary Restriction and Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2010 and shall come into force on 25 October 2010.

2. In this Order –

“the motorway” means the southbound carriageway of the M1 from its junction with the exit slip road at Junction 20 to its junction with the exit slip road at Junction 19;

“the slip road” means the slip road leading-

- (i) from the southbound carriageway of the M1 to the depot at Misterton: and
- (ii) to the southbound carriageway of the M1 from the depot at Misterton;

“the Regulations” means the Motorways Traffic (England and Wales) Regulations 1982(b);

“a hard shoulder”	means the hard shoulder, within the meaning of Regulation 3(1)(e) of the Regulations, which is adjacent to the motorway;
"the works period"	means the period starting at 20:00 hours on Monday 1 November 2010 and ending when the said works have been completed;

and a reference to an article followed by a number is a reference to the article in this Order which bears that number.

3. Subject as mentioned in articles 5 and 6, no person shall, during the works period, drive any motor vehicle at a speed exceeding 50 miles per hour in the motorway.

4. Subject as mentioned in articles 5 and 6, no person shall, during the works period, cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed in the motorway or a slip road.

5. The provisions of articles 3 and 4 shall apply only during such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs.

6. The provisions of articles 3 and 4 shall not apply to any vehicle –

(a) being used for police, fire brigade or ambulance purposes; or

(b) proceeding at the direction of, or with the permission of, a police constable or traffic officer in uniform;

and nothing in article 4 shall apply to any vehicle being used for or in connection with the said works or by a traffic officer in uniform.

7. During the works period, regulations 5 and (in so far as it relates to a vehicle being driven) 9 of the Regulations are hereby suspended in respect of a hard shoulder, at such times and to such extent as may from time to time be indicated by traffic signs.
