The M5 Motorway (Junction 24) (Temporary Restriction of Traffic) Order 2010

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the M5 Motorway ("the M5"), is satisfied that traffic on a length of that road near Bridgwater in the County of Somerset should be restricted because works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14(1)(a) and (7) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), hereby makes the following Order:-

1. This Order may be cited as the M5 Motorway (Junction 24) (Temporary Restriction of Traffic) Order 2010 and shall come into force on 5 November 2010.

2. In this Order –

"the M5" means the southbound carriageway of the M5 near Junction 24 from a point at the centre of Bath Road Overbridge (north of Junction 24) to a point at the centre of Moon Lane Overbridge (south of Junction 24);

"the hard shoulder" means the hard shoulder within the meaning of regulation 3(1)(e) of the Regulations which is adjacent to the M5;

"the Regulations" means the Motorways Traffic (England and Wales) Regulations 1982(b);

"overall width" has the meaning given in regulation 3(2) of the Road Vehicles (Construction and Use) Regulations 1986(c);

"the works" mean the replacement of defective bridge joints on Huntworth viaduct;

"the works period" means the period starting at 00.01 hours on Sunday 7 November 2010 or any subsequent day and ending when the said works have been completed;

and a reference to an article followed by a number is a reference to the article in this Order which bears that number.

3. Subject as mentioned in article 5, no person shall, during the works period, drive any motor vehicle at a speed exceeding 50 miles per hour on the M5 and the hard shoulder.

4. Subject as mentioned in articles 5 and 6, no person shall, during the works period, cause or permit any vehicle with an overall width exceeding 2.5 metres to enter or proceed in:

- (a) a lane in a carriageway or length of carriageway where only that lane in that carriageway or length and the hard shoulder adjacent to that carriageway or length, are open for use by traffic proceeding in that carriageway, or
- (b) any lane other than the left hand or nearside of two or more lanes in a carriageway or length which are open for use by traffic proceeding in that carriageway;

and in this article a reference to a carriageway is a reference to the southbound carriageway of the M5.

5. The provisions of articles 3 and 4 shall apply only during such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs and shall not apply to:

- (a) a vehicle being used for police, fire and rescue authority or ambulance purposes;
- (b) anything done at the direction of, or with the permission of, a constable.

6. The provisions of article 4 shall not apply to a vehicle being used in connection with the said works, for traffic officer purposes or for winter maintenance purposes.

7. During the works period, regulation 5 and (insofar as it relates to a vehicle being driven) regulation 9 of the Regulations are hereby suspended, in respect of the hard shoulder, at such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs.
