ROAD TRAFFIC

The M62 Motorway (Junction 37 to Junction 38) (Temporary Restriction and Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2011

Made	-	19th July 2011
Coming into force	-	24th July 2011

WHEREAS, the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the M62 Motorway and connecting roads, in the East Riding of Yorkshire, is satisfied that traffic on that motorway should be restricted and prohibited because traffic loop reinstallation works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14(1)(a) and (7) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(**a**), makes the following Order: -

1. This Order may be cited as the M62 Motorway (Junction 37 to Junction 38) (Temporary Restriction and Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2011 and shall come into force on 24th July 2011.

2. Subject as mentioned in article 3 of this Order, no person shall, during a period of 10 hours starting at 20.00 hours on Monday 25th July 2011 or any subsequent night thereafter until the said works have been completed, cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed in the M62 Motorway eastbound carriageway from a point 350 metres west to a point 125 metres east of the centreline of Kilpin overbridge, a distance of approximately 450 metres.

3. The provisions of article 2 of this order shall apply only during such times and to such extent as shall, from time to time, be indicated by traffic signs and shall not apply to:

- (a) a vehicle being used for police, fire and rescue authority or ambulance purposes;
- (b) a vehicle being used for, or in connection with, the said works, or for traffic officer purposes; or
- (c) anything done at the direction of, or with the permission of, a constable or traffic officer in uniform.

4. The provisions of regulations 5 and (in so far as it relates to a vehicle being driven) 9 of the Motorways Traffic (England and Wales) Regulations 1982(**b**) are suspended in relation to the hard shoulders adjacent to the M62 Motorway as described in article 2 at such times and to such extent as may, from time to time, be indicated by traffic signs; and in this article "hard shoulder" has the meaning given in regulation 3(1)(e) of those Regulations.
