The Overseas Territories (Change of Name) (No. 8) Order 2011

At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 14th day of December 2011

The Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council

Her Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred upon Her by section 315(2) of the Merchant Shipping Act 1995(**a**) and section 150 of the Senior Courts Act 1981(**b**), is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is ordered, as follows:

Citation and commencement

1. This Order may be cited as the Overseas Territories (Change of Name) (No. 8) Order 2011 and shall come into force on 14th January 2012.

Amendment of certain instruments

2.—(1) Article 4 of the Merchant Shipping Act 1979 (Saint Helena) Order 1980(c) is amended by substituting for the words "St Helena and its Dependencies" the words "St Helena, Ascension and Tristan da Cunha".

- (2) The Admiralty Jurisdiction (St Helena and its Dependencies) Order 1969(d) is amended by -
 - (a) substituting for the words "St Helena and its Dependencies", wherever they appear, the words "St Helena, Ascension and Tristan da Cunha"; and
 - (b) substituting for the words "St Helena or its Dependencies", wherever they appear, the words "St Helena, Ascension or Tristan da Cunha";

and accordingly the Order may be cited as the Admiralty Jurisdiction (St Helena, Ascension and Tristan da Cunha) Order 1969.
