## ROAD TRAFFIC

The M62 Motorway (Junction 21 Eastbound Carriageway and Entry Slip Road) (Temporary Prohibition and Restriction of Traffic) Order 2011

 Made
 17th February 2011

 Coming into force
 20th February 2011

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the M62 Motorway and its slip roads, is satisfied that traffic on sections of that motorway and on one of those slip roads in the Borough of Rochdale in Greater Manchester should be prohibited and restricted because works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14(1)(a) and (7) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a) hereby makes the following Order:-

**1.** This Order may be cited as the M62 Motorway (Junction 21 Eastbound Carriageway and Entry Slip Road) (Temporary Prohibition and Restriction of Traffic) Order 2011 and shall come into force on 20th February 2011.

## 2. In this Order:

"the motorway" means the M62 Motorway;

"the slip road" means the entry slip road leading to the eastbound carriageway of the motorway at Junction 21;

"the tip of the nosing of the entry slip road" means the first point where the entry slip road joins the carriageway of the motorway;

"the tip of the nosing of the exit slip road" means the last point where the exit slip road leaves the carriageway of the motorway;

"the first length of carriageway" means the eastbound carriageway of the motorway from the tip of the nosing of the exit slip road at Junction 21 to a point 600 metres east of the tip of the nosing of the entry slip road at Junction 21;

"the second length of carriageway" means the eastbound carriageway of the motorway from the tip of the nosing of the entry slip road at Junction 21 to a point 800 metres east of the tip of the nosing of the entry slip road at Junction 21;

"the third length of carriageway" means the eastbound carriageway of the motorway from the tip of the nosing of the entry slip road at Junction 21 to a point 700 metres east of the tip of the nosing of the entry slip road at Junction 21;

"hardshoulder" has the meaning given in regulation 3(1)(e) of the Motorways Traffic (England and Wales) Regulations 1982(a);

"the length of hardshoulder" means the hardshoulder adjacent to the third length of carriageway;

"the works period" means two periods overnight between 2200 hours and 0500 hours during a period starting on Monday 21 February 2011 and ending on Monday 21 March 2011. However, work may start and continue between the same times on subsequent nights or continue overnight until completed, for such period not exceeding 18 months as shall be required to complete the work;

"works" means resurfacing, loop cutting and maintenance works on the motorway and slip road.

- **3.** Subject as mentioned in article 6 of this Order, during the works period, no person shall cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed in the first length of carriageway or the slip road.
- **4.** Subject as mentioned in article 6 of this Order, during the works period, no person shall cause or permit any vehicle to be driven in the length of hardshoulder defined in article 2 of this Order or the second length of carriageway at a speed exceeding 50 miles per hour.
- **5.** The provisions of regulations 5 and (in so far as it relates to a vehicle being driven) 9 of the Motorways Traffic (England and Wales) Regulations 1982 (**b**) are suspended in relation to the length of hardshoulder defined in article 2 of this Order at such times and to such extent as may be indicated by traffic signs; and in this article, "hardshoulder" has the meaning given in regulation 3(1)(e) of those Regulations.
- **6.** The provisions of articles 3 and 4 of this Order shall apply only during such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs, and shall not apply to a vehicle being used for emergency purposes by the police, fire and rescue authority or ambulance services or anything done at the direction, or with the permission, of a constable, or a traffic officer in uniform.

And nothing in article 3 of this Order shall apply to any vehicle being used in connection with the said works or by traffic officers.
