## ROAD TRAFFIC

## The M50 Motorway (Junctions 2 to 4) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2012

Made - - - 24th December 2012

Coming into force - - 31st December 2012

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the M50 Motorway ("the M50") and connecting roads, is satisfied that traffic on a length of that motorway and on one of those connecting roads, between Junctions 2 and 4 in the County of Herefordshire, should be prohibited because works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14(1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), hereby makes the following Order: -

1. This Order may be cited as the M50 Motorway (Junctions 2 to 4) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2012 and shall come into force on 31st December 2012.

## **2.** In this Order:

"the motorway" means the westbound carriageway of the M50 from its

junction with the exit slip road at Junction 2 to its roundabout junction with the A40, A449 and B4221 at

Junction 4;

"a slip road" means –

(i) the slip road leading to the westbound carriageway of

the M50 at Junction 2; and

(ii) the slip road leading to the westbound carriageway of

the M50 at Junction 3;

"the works period" means the period starting at 22.30 hours on Monday 7th

January 2013 and ending when the said works have been

completed;

and a reference to an article followed by a number is a reference to the article in this Order which bears that number.

**3.** Subject as mentioned in article 4, no person shall, during the works period, cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed on the motorway or a slip road.

- **4.** The provisions of article 3 shall apply only during such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs and shall not apply to any vehicle
  - (i) being used for police, fire brigade or ambulance purposes;
  - (ii) proceeding at the direction of, or with the permission of, a police constable, or traffic officer in uniform; or
  - (iii) being used in connection with the said works or by a traffic officer in uniform.
