## ROAD TRAFFIC

## The M4 Motorway (Junctions 5 - 6) (Temporary Restriction and Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2013

 Made
 10th June 2013

 Coming into force
 29th June 2013

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the M4 Motorway and connecting roads, is satisfied that traffic should be restricted and prohibited on lengths of that motorway and on some of those connecting roads because works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14(1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), hereby makes the following Order:-

**1.** This Order may be cited as the M4 Motorway (Junctions 5 - 6) (Temporary Restriction and Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2013 and shall come into force on 29th June 2013.

## 2. In this Order:

"the motorway" means the M4 Motorway in the Royal Borough of Windsor & Maidenhead and the Borough of Slough;

"the Regulations" means the regulation 16(2) of the Motorways Traffic (England and Wales) Regulations 1982(**b**);

"the length of motorway" means both carriageways of the motorway between the Windsor Branch Railway Bridge east of Junction 6 (A355) at marker post 36/5 and a point 860 metres east of Sutton Lane overbridge east of Junction 5 (A4) at marker post 29/5;

"the eastbound carriageway" and "the westbound carriageway" mean, respectively, the eastbound carriageway and the westbound carriageway of the length of motorway;

"a hard shoulder" means the hard shoulder, within the meaning of regulation 3(1)(e) of the Regulations, which is adjacent to the eastbound carriageway, the westbound carriageway or a second slip road;

"recovery vehicle" has the meaning given in paragraph 5 of Schedule 1 to the Vehicle Excise and Registration Act 1994(c);

"overall width" has the meaning given in regulation 3(2) of the Road Vehicles (Construction and Use) Regulations 1986(**d**);

"abnormal load" means a vehicle having an overall width exceeding 9 feet 6 inches;

"a length of carriageway" means -

- (i) the eastbound carriageway of the motorway between the eastbound "off" slip road at Junction 6 at marker post 37/5 + 50 and the eastbound "on" slip road at Junction 5 at marker post 30/3 + 50, or
- (ii) the westbound carriageway of the motorway between the westbound "off" slip road at Junction 5 at marker post 30/6 and the westbound "on" slip road at Junction 6 at marker post 37/5 + 50;

"a first slip road" means –

- (i) the road leading to the westbound carriageway of the motorway from the A4 at Junction 5, or
- (ii) the road leading to the eastbound carriageway of the motorway from the A355 at Junction 6;

"a second slip road" means any road leading to or from the eastbound carriageway or to or from the westbound carriageway at Junction 5 (A4);

"works" mean resurfacing and all associated work on the motorway;

"a first works period" means a period of 24 hours starting at 0001 hours on Monday 1st July 2013 or on any subsequent day until 28th December 2014;

"a second works period" means a period of 8 hours starting at 2200 hours on Monday 1st July 2013 or on any subsequent day until 28th December 2014;

and a reference to an article followed by a number is a reference to the article in this Order which bears that number.

- **3.** Subject as mentioned in articles 5 and 7, no person shall, during a second works period, cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed in a length of carriageway or a first slip road.
- **4.** Subject as mentioned in articles 5, 7 and 8, no person shall, during a first works period, drive any motor vehicle at a speed exceeding 50 miles per hour on the length of motorway, a hard shoulder or a second slip road.
- **5.** The provisions of articles 3, 4 and 6 shall apply only at such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs.
- **6.** Subject as mentioned in articles 5, 7 and 8, no person shall, during a first works period, cause or permit any vehicle with an overall width exceeding 6 feet 6 inches to enter or proceed in -
  - (a) any lane in a carriageway or length of carriageway, where one or more lanes in that carriageway or length and the hard shoulder adjacent to that carriageway or length are open for use by traffic; or
  - (b) any lane other than the nearside lane of two or more lanes in a carriageway or length of carriageway, where only those lanes are open for use by traffic;

and in this article a reference to a carriageway is a reference to the eastbound carriageway or the westbound carriageway.

- 7. (1) Nothing in articles 3 or 6 shall apply to -
  - (a) a recovery vehicle or a vehicle being used in connection with the said works;
  - (b) a vehicle being used for police, ambulance, traffic officer or fire and rescue authority purposes;
  - (c) anything done at the direction of, or with the permission of, a constable or traffic officer in uniform; or
  - (d) any vehicle being used for winter maintenance purposes.
- (2) Nothing in article 4 shall apply to a vehicle being used for police, ambulance or fire and rescue authority purposes and to vehicles falling within regulation 3(4) of the Road Traffic

Exemptions (Special Forces) (Variation and Amendment) Regulations 2011(a) when used in accordance with regulation 3(5) of those Regulations.

- (3) Nothing in article 6 shall apply to an abnormal load.
- **8.** During a first works period, the provisions of regulations 5 and (insofar as it relates to a vehicle being driven) 9 of the Regulations are hereby suspended, in respect of a hard shoulder, at such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs.
