## **ROAD TRAFFIC**

## The A417 Trunk Road (Air Balloon Roundabout to Burford Road Junction, Gloucestershire) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2013

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the A417 Trunk Road ("the A417") and connecting roads, is satisfied that traffic on a length of that road and some of those connecting roads in the District of Cotswold in the County of Gloucestershire should be prohibited because works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14(1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), hereby makes the following Order:-

**1.** This Order may be cited as the A417 Trunk Road (Air Balloon Roundabout to Burford Road Junction, Gloucestershire) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2013 and shall come into force on 7th September 2013.

2. In this Order –

"the A417" means (i) the A417 southbound carriageway from the southern edge of the Air Balloon Roundabout, near Cheltenham, to the tip of the nosing of the southbound entry slip road at the A429 Burford Road Junction, Cirencester; and (ii) the A417 northbound carriageway from the tip of the nosing of the northbound exit slip road at the A429 Burford Road Junction, Cirencester, to the southern edge of the Air Balloon Roundabout, near Cheltenham;

"the slip roads" mean (i) the southbound entry slip road at the A417 Quarry Junction; (ii) the southbound exit slip road at the A417 Quarry Junction; (iii) the southbound exit slip road at the A417 Burford Road Junction; (iv) the northbound entry slip road at the A417 Burford Road Junction; (v) the northbound exit slip road at the A417 Quarry Junction; and (vi) the northbound entry slip road at the A417 Quarry Junction;

"the tip of the nosing" means the first point where an entry slip road joins the carriageway of a trunk road or the last point where an exit slip road leaves the carriageway of a trunk road;

"the works" mean routine maintenance works including surfacing, studding, white lining,;

"a works period" means a period of 10 hours starting at 20.00 hours on Monday 9th September 2013 or on any subsequent day and ending when the said works have been completed;

"the works period" means the period starting at 20.00 hrs on Monday 9th September 2013 and ending when the said works are completed;

and a reference to an article followed by a number is a reference to the article in this Order which bears that number.

**3.** Subject as mentioned in **article 4**, no person shall, during a works period, cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed in the A417 and the slip roads.

**4.** Subject as mentioned in **article 4**, no person shall, during the works period, cause or permit any vehicle to enter, proceed or remain in: (a) Hare Bushes laybys adjacent to the northbound and southbound carriageways of the A417 situated approximately 1.5 kilometres north of Burford Roundabout; (b) Dartley Bottom laybys adjacent to the northbound and southbound carriageways of the A417, situated approximately 2 kilometres north of Daglingworth Junction and (c) Elkstone layby adjacent to the southbound carriageway of the A417, situated approximately 7 kilometres south of Air Balloon Roundabout.

**5.** The provisions of article 3 and 4 shall apply only during such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs and shall not apply to:

(a) a vehicle being used for police, traffic officer, fire and rescue authority or ambulance purposes;

(b) anything done at the direction of, or with the permission of, a constable or traffic officer in uniform;

(c) a vehicle being used in connection with the said works.
