The Air Navigation (Restriction of Flying) (RNAS Yeovilton) (No. 2) Regulations 2016

The Secretary of State has decided that it is necessary in the public interest to restrict flying in the vicinity of RNAS Yeovilton, Somerset by reason of the Captain Eric Brown Commemorative Day Event that is scheduled to take place there.

The Secretary of State makes the following Regulations in exercise of the powers conferred by article 161 of the Air Navigation Order $2009(\mathbf{a})$.

Citation and commencement

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Air Navigation (Restriction of Flying) (RNAS Yeovilton) (No. 2) Regulations 2016 and come into force on 21st July 2016.

Interpretation

2. In regulation 3(1) the times referred to are Co-ordinated Universal Time(**b**).

Restricted airspace

3.—(1) Subject to paragraph (2), between 1330 hours and 1530 hours on 21st July 2016, no aircraft is to fly below 6,100 feet above mean sea level within the area bounded by a circle having a radius of 6 nautical miles whose centre is at 510030N 0023844W.

(2) Paragraph (1) does not apply to any aircraft flying in accordance with a clearance issued by the air traffic control unit at RNAS Yeovilton.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Regulations)

These Regulations impose restrictions on flying in airspace in the vicinity of RNAS Yeovilton, Somerset for the Captain Eric Brown Commemorative Day event that is scheduled to take place there on 21st July 2016. A large number of civil and military aircraft will be involved in highenergy manoeuvres during this event. Therefore the Civil Aviation Authority and the Department for Transport agree that flying should be restricted in the vicinity of the displays for reasons of public safety.

In relation to regulation 3, the term 'aircraft' includes aircraft as classified by Part A of Schedule 3 to the Air Navigation Order 2009. It also includes, by virtue of article 253(3) of that Order, any small balloon, any kite weighing not more than two kilograms, any small unmanned aircraft and any parachute including a parascending parachute.

The times mentioned in paragraph 3(1) are Universal Co-ordinated Time (UTC), which for the purpose of these Regulations is one hour behind British Summer Time.

Full details of the Statutory Instrument will be promulgated by Aeronautical Information Circular and NOTAM.
