Sir E. Grey to the German Ambassador.

Your Excellency, Foreign Office, November 23, 1909.

With reference to my note of the 7th June last on the subject of the renewal, for one year, of the Agreement between the United Kingdom and Germany providing for the settlement by arbitration of certain classes of questions which may arise between the two Governments, signed at London on the 12th July, 1904, I have the honour to inform your Excellency that His Majesty's Government are prepared to extend the renewal of the Agreement for a further period of four years from the date of its expiry on the 12th July, 1910.

I should be glad to learn from your Excellency that the Imperial Government are equally prepared to extend the renewal of the Agreement for this period, in which case the present note and your Excellency's reply would be sufficient to give legal validity to this understanding between the two Governments.
