Dublin, July 29, 1986. recent discussions on trade

I have the honour to refer to the recent discussions on trade relations between representatives of the Governments of the Netherlands and Saorstát Eireann, and to confirm that, in respect of the articles set out in the Annex to this Note, which are at present subject to quota restrictions in the Netherlands, the quantities of such articles originating in Saorstát Eireann which shall be permitted to be imported into the Netherlands in the year beginning the 1st August, 1936, shall not be less than those specified in the said Annex, so long as no changes are brought about by the action of the Government of Saorstát Eireann in the treatment which articles originating in the Netherlands at present enjoy on their importation into Saorstát Eireann.

I have the honour to acknowledge receipt of the Note of this date by which, following the recent trade discussions between representatives of our two Governments, you were good enough to confirm that, in respect of the articles set out in the Annex to the Note, which are at present subject to quota restrictions in the Netherlands, the quantities of such articles originating in Saorstát Eireann which shall be permitted to be imported into the Netherlands in the year beginning the 1st August, 1936, shall not be less than those specified in the said Annex, so long as no changes are brought about by the action of the Government of Saorstát Eireann in the treatment which articles originating in the Netherlands at present enjoy on their importation into Saorstát Eireann.
