#### The Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs to the Japanese Ambassador

Your Excellency.

### Foreign Office,

December 23, 1953.

I have the honour to propose to your Excellency that the Sterling Payments Agreement between the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the Government of Japan signed in Tokyo on the 31st of August,  $1951(^{1})$ , and extended by an Exchange of Notes dated the 15th of August,  $1952(^{2})$ , for a period of four months to the 31st of December, 1952, and by a further Exchange of Notes dated the 27th of December, 1952(<sup>3</sup>), for a further period of one year to the 31st of December, 1953, shall be further extended for a period of one month to . the 31st of January, 1954.

I have the honour further to propose that the two Exchanges of Notes of the 31st of August, 1951, dealing, respectively, with the understanding about consultation and with facilities for transfers of sterling between Japan and countries outside the scheduled territories, should be extended for a period of one month to the 31st of January, 1954.

If the Government of Japan agree to the foregoing proposals I have the honour to suggest that the present Note and your Excellency's reply shall be regarded as constituting an Agreement to this effect between the two Governments.

I avail myself of this opportunity of renewing to your Excellency the assurances of my highest consideration.
