I have the honour to refer to recent discussions between representatives of the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and of the Government of the United States of America concerning paragraphs 3 (d) and 7 of the Memorandum annexed to the Notes exchanged at London on the 15th of February, 1960 on the Setting up of a Ballistic Missile Early Warning Station in the United Kingdom. As a result of these discussions I have the honour to propose that in each of those paragraphs "5 years" shall be amended to read "10 years".

If the above proposal is acceptable to the Government of the United States of America, I have the honour to suggest that this Note and Your Excellency's reply to that effect shall constitute an Agreement between our two Governments.
