#### **EXCHANGE OF NOTES**

BETWEEN THE GOVERNMENT OF THE UNITED KINGDOM OF GREAT BRITAIN AND NORTHERN IRELAND AND THE GOVERNMENT OF THE FRENCH REPUBLIC FURTHER PROLONGING THE FILM CO-PRODUCTION AGREEMENT SIGNED AT LONDON ON 21 SEPTEMBER 1965

The Minister for Foreign Affairs of the French Republic to the British Chargé d'Affaires at Paris

Monsieur le Chargé d'affaires,

Ministère des Affaires Etrangères, Paris, le 13 septembre 1968.

Me référant à l'article 8 de l'" Accord de coproduction cinématographique entre le Gouvernement de la République Française et le Gouvernement du Royaume-Uni de Grande-Bretagne et d'Irlande du Nord", signé à Londres le 21 septembre 1965, modifié et prorogé en vertu de l'échange de lettres du 3 mai 1967, j'ai l'honneur de proposer que cet accord soit maintenu en vigueur pour une nouvelle période de 18 mois, du 6 novembre 1968 au 5 mai 1970.

I have the honour to acknowledge receipt of Your Excellency's Note dated the 13th of September 1968, which in translation reads as follows:

"With reference to Article 8 of the Film Co-production Agreement between the Government of the French Republic and the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland signed at London on the 21st of September, 1965,(1) as modified and prolonged by the Exchange of Notes of the 3rd of May, 1967,(2) I have the honour

to propose that this Agreement shall continue in force for a further period of eighteen months, from the 6th of November, 1968 to the 5th of May, 1970,

If this proposal is acceptable to the Government of the United Kingdom I suggest that the present Note and your reply shall constitute an agreement between the two Governments in this matter."

In reply, I have the honour to inform Your Excellency that the above proposal is acceptable to the Government of the United Kingdom, who therefore agree that Your Excellency's Note and this reply shall constitute an Agreement between the two Governments in this matter.

I avail myself of this opportunity of renewing to Your Excellency the assurance of my highest consideration.
