ROAD TRAFFIC, WALES

The A5 Trunk Road (Betws-y-Coed, Conwy) (Temporary Traffic Prohibitions and Restrictions) Order 2024

Made 22 October 2024

Coming into force 4 November 2024

The Welsh Ministers, as traffic authority for the relevant length of the A5 trunk road, are satisfied that traffic on a specified length of the trunk road should be prohibited and/or restricted because of works proposed on or near the road.

The Welsh Ministers, therefore, in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by section 14(1), (4) and (7) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984⁽¹⁾, make this Order.

Title and commencement

1. The title of this Order is the A5 Trunk Road (Betws-y-Coed, Conwy) (Temporary Traffic Prohibitions and Restrictions) Order 2024 and this Order comes into force on 4 November 2024.

Interpretation

2. In this Order—

“exempted vehicle” (“*cerbyd esempt*”) means—

- (a) any vehicle being used by the emergency services for the purposes described in section 87 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act

By virtue of S.I. 1999/672, and section 162 of, and paragraph 30 of Schedule 11 to, the Government of Wales Act 2006 (c. 32), these powers are now exercisable by the Welsh Ministers in relation to Wales.

1984(1) or in connection with the works giving rise to this Order;

(b) any vehicle being used for naval, military or air force purposes and being driven by a person for the time being subject to the orders of a member of the armed forces of the Crown, who is a member of the special forces—

(i) in response, or for practice in responding, to a national security emergency by a person who has been trained in driving at high speeds; or

(ii) for the purpose of training a person in driving vehicles at high speeds;

“special forces” (*“lluoedd arbennig”*) means those units of the armed forces the maintenance of whose capabilities is the responsibility of the Director of Special Forces or which are for the time being subject to the operational command of that Director;

“the trunk road” (*“y gefnffordd”*) means the A5 London to Holyhead trunk road at Betws-y-Coed that extends from the 20 mph sign on the southbound approach into Betws-y-Coed to its junction with Station Road;

“works period” (*“cyfnod y gwaith”*) means intermittent periods commencing at 17:30 hours on 4 November 2024 and ending when the temporary traffic signs for each period of works are removed.

Prohibitions and restrictions

3. No person may, during the works period, cause or permit any vehicle to wait on the sides of the trunk road.

4. No person may, during the works period, drive any motor vehicle at a speed exceeding 10 miles per hour on the trunk road.

5. No person may, during the works period, use or permit the use of a vehicle, other than an exempted vehicle, in such a way that it overtakes any other vehicle on the trunk road during such times as the restriction referred to in article 4 is in operation.

Application

6.—(1) The prohibitions and restrictions in articles 3, 4 and 5 apply only during such times and to such extent as indicated by traffic signs.

(2) No speed limits imposed by this Order apply to an exempted vehicle.

Suspensions

7. Any statutory provisions restricting the speed of vehicles on the trunk road are suspended during such times as the restriction specified in article 4 is in operation.

Duration of this Order

8. The maximum duration for this Order is 18 months.
