# ROAD TRAFFIC, WALES

The A470 Trunk Road (North of Rhayader, Powys) (Temporary Prohibition of Vehicles) Order 2024

Made 8 March 2024

Coming into force 15 March 2024

The Welsh Ministers, as traffic authority for the A470 trunk road, are satisfied that traffic on a specified length of the trunk road should be prohibited because of works proposed on or near the road.

The Welsh Ministers, therefore, in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by section 14(1) and (4) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(1), make this Order.

### Title and commencement

**1.** The title of this Order is the A470 Trunk Road (North of Rhayader, Powys) (Temporary Prohibition of Vehicles) Order 2024 and this Order comes into force on 15 March 2024.

### Interpretation

#### 2. In this Order—

"exempted vehicle" ("cerbyd esempt") means any vehicle being used by the emergency services or in connection with the works giving rise to this Order;

"the trunk road" ("y gefnffordd") means the A470 Cardiff to Llangurig trunk road;

"works period" ("cyfnod y gwaith") means intermittent periods commencing at 19:00 hours on 15 March 2024 and ending when the temporary traffic signs for each period of works are permanently removed.

### **Prohibition**

**3.** No person may, during the works period, drive any vehicle, other than an exempted vehicle, on the length of the trunk road that extends from a point 300 metres north-west of the centre-point of its junction with the vehicular access of the property known as Cefn Bychan, located approximately 2 kilometres north of Rhayader to a point 375 metres north of the centre-point of its junction with the county road leading to St. Harmon at Pont Marteg, located approximately 4 kilometres north of Rhayader, Powys.

### Application

**4.** The prohibition in article 3 applies only during such times and to such extent as indicated by traffic signs.

### **Duration of this Order**

**5.** The maximum duration of this Order is 18 months.
