**ROAD TRAFFIC, WALES**

**The A470 Trunk Road (Llyswen,  
Powys) (Temporary Prohibition of  
Vehicles) Order 2025**

*Made* 3 March 2025

*Coming into force* 6 March 2025

The Welsh Ministers, as traffic authority for the relevant length of the A470 trunk road, are satisfied that traffic on a specified length of the trunk road should be prohibited because of works proposed on or near the road.

The Welsh Ministers, therefore, in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by section 14(1) and (4) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984<sup>(1)</sup>, make this Order.

**Title and commencement**

1. The title of this Order is the A470 Trunk Road (Llyswen, Powys) (Temporary Prohibition of Vehicles) Order 2025 and this Order comes into force on 6 March 2025.

**Interpretation**

2. In this Order—

“the trunk road” (“*y gefnffordd*”) means the A470 Cardiff to Llangurig trunk Road;

“works period” (“*cyfnod y gwaith*”) means the period commencing at 07:00 hours on 6 March

2025 and ending when the temporary traffic signs for the works are permanently removed;

**Prohibition**

3. No person may, during the works period, drive any vehicle on the length of the trunk road that extends from its junction with the access road to Bryndu Farm to the centrepont of its junction with the A479 in Llyswen.

**Application**

4. The prohibition in article 3 applies only during such times and to such extent as indicated by traffic signs.

**Duration of this Order**

5. The maximum duration of this Order is 18 months.
